

EGG STORAGE IS ACTIVE ON COAST

Coolers in Portland Show 21,317 Cases Put Away At Present Time

Portland, Ore., April 1.—Egg storage has been active on the coast during the past week, especially at Portland. Local coolers now show 21,317 cases put away, while holdings at this time last year amounted to only 9,350 cases.

Egg shipments have been coming in heavy during the last few days and operators have been accumulating holdings.

The egg market is steady today with values unchanged on the local board. Butter is a trifle easier in the local market with standard cubes off a half and prime firsts a cent on the exchange.

The open market is firm with the 1924 crop pretty well cleaned up. Late estimates show approximately 40 carloads of No. 1 grade left. Buyers are paying around \$3.25 to \$3.50 at country landing points. The wholesale market is 25 to 50c higher with best Sherwood stock held at \$4 to \$4.50 per sack.

Country receipts are unchanged. Receipts moderate and demand is good for top grade stuff.

Poultry receipts continue light with the market strong.
