

GOVERNOR BACKED BY COURT RULING

SALEM, Ore., April 2.—The authority of the governor to appoint special prosecutors in counties to handle prohibition cases is upheld by an opinion of the supreme court today, written by Justice Hand, dismissing the action of the state, on information of A. J. Moore, district attorney for Deschutes county, against Ross Farnham.

The case was an original proceeding in quo warranto.

Farnham was appointed by Governor Pierce as a special prosecutor to take charge of prohibition cases in Deschutes county and disburse all funds provided by law for the enforcement of the prohibition law. The action was instituted to have determined the right of the special prosecu-

I. C. C. Authority to Be Questioned in Wool Rate Hearing

PORTLAND, Ore., April 2.—Before the interstate commerce commission reaches a decision on application of the Boston Wool Trade association joint rail and water rates from the production interior via Pacific coast ports to the Atlantic seaboard, its constitutional authority will be questioned in briefs and oral arguments by the transcontinental railways.

This was revealed by W. A. Robbins, attorney for the Union Pacific system, here Saturday, hear the close of the wool rate hearing before Commissioner J. B. Campbell. The hearing will be continued at Chicago April 3.

Robbins pointed out that routes of intercoastal and foreign steamship lines passing through the Panama Canal are in international zones far beyond control of the United States

Colonel Forbes Is Little Better

BOSTON, April 2.—The condition of Colonel Charles Forbes, former head of the United States veterans' bureau, who suffered a shock last Friday, was described by his physicians today as "moderately comfortable." His illness was diagnosed as cerebral thrombosis, a condition arising from the stoppage of circulation through part of the brain due to a blood clot.

"Colonel Forbes is moderately comfortable today," the early bulletin said. "His entire left side is paralyzed. No marked improvement is anticipated or radical change expected during the next few days."

Armory Drill is To be Continued

WASHINGTON, April 2.—President Coolidge has directed Secretary Weeks to proceed with the war department program of armory drills for the national guard up to the requirement of law.

Mr. Coolidge has not been informed to what extent the program will require expenditure of the funds for that purpose appropriated by congress without the sanction of the budget bureau. Use of these funds, had been held up by the president pending an investigation for the need of them.

It is the president's belief that the order he has given Secretary Weeks will satisfy national guard officials who have discussed the matter with him.
