

EUGENE ELKS WILL HAVE LEGION DRUM CORPS FOR PARADE

Heading the Eugene lodge of Elks in the parade to be held at Portland during the annual convention of the E. P. O. E. the week of July 10 will be the drum and bugle corps of the Eugene post of the American Legion, according to plans made by the special committee of the local lodge arranging for the participation at the national session. This committee headed by J. S. Maglady is handling all details of the Eugene invasion of the convention city.

Another attractive feature of the visit of the local delegation will be the presentation of 500 fancy packages of candied fruit packed by the Eugene Fruit Growers association. These packages will be distributed among the visiting Elks at the convention at Portland and also put aboard some of the special convention trains when they stop at Eugene on their way to the north. It is announced.

An Elks glow club of from 10 to 25 vocalists will also entertain the Eugene headquarters at the Imperial hotel during convention week and the singers will also take part in the parade, according to present arrangements.

The presentation of the gift packages of candied fruit will be a big publicity boost for Lane county as Elks from throughout the United States will be at Portland for the season," Mr. Maglady said.

CITY PLANNING FOR EUGENE IS SOUGHT

This board. The head of any council committee whose department is concerned in any plan of the board will be for the time being an ex-officio member.

The committee members by lot shall choose who will retire at the end of 1925, the end of 1926, and the end of 1927. The terms for members will be three years.

Other provisions are:

"To recommend to the council of the City of Eugene plans for the regulation of the future growth, development and beautification of the said city in respect to its public and private buildings and works, streets, parks, grounds and vacant lots.

"To recommend to the council plans consistent with the future growth and development of said city in order to secure to said city, and its inhabitants, sanitation and proper service of public utilities, shipping and transportation facilities.

"To make recommendations to any public authorities or any corporation or individuals of such city with reference to the location of any proposed buildings, structures or works.

"To recommend to the council of said city the approval or disapproval of maps or prints of subdivisions of land.

"To prepare plans and maps for the future systematic development and betterment of physical aspects of said city.

"To recommend location, width, grade, and names of streets, and the location, alteration, or relocation of public buildings, municipal decorations, works of art, etc.

"To make recommendations of proposed plats and subdivisions.

"To make surveys, maps and recommendations for zones, parks, traffic ways, industrial growth, and other matters for the betterment of said city.

"To foster civic pride and keep the public duly informed on matters that affect the efficiency, growth, expansion and appearance of said city.

"Section 6. The members of said commission shall not receive any compensation for services as members of the Planning commission, and the secretary of said Planning commission shall serve as such without compensation. The said Planning commission

shall have no authority to make any expenditures on behalf of said city, or to obligate said city for the payment of any sums of money; provided however, that said Planning commission may expend from time to time, for their necessary expenditures for fulfilling their duties, such sums of money as the city council of said city shall authorize to be expended for said purposes from time to time by ordinance."

TAX RETURNS SOON CLEARED, IS REPORT

Approximately 6000 letters containing tax returns are awaiting their turn at the collector's office and it will be perhaps two weeks before receipts can be mailed out to many of these property owners, according to Lloyd Howe, deputy sheriff in charge of collections.

All of these letters received before the time limit expired April 5 have been stamped and they will not be handled in alphabetical order. A total of about 18,000 tax statements were sent out for the first half and collections so far are somewhat better than during a similar period of last year and much better than the year previous, Mr. Howe states.
