PINCHOT AND WIFE SEEK OFFICE

Congress to Be Goal of Governor of Pennsylvania; Mrs. Pinchot In Right There When It Comes to Helping in Campaign

WASHINGTON, April 11.—Governor Gifford Pinchot of Pennsylvania with his "home dry" ideas for prohibition, is causing regular Republicans no little worry.
For it is reported that the governor plans to run for the Senate in 1936 on a strict prohibition platform and that if he wins he intends to make a bid for the Republican nomination in 1938.
And he is not going to make his race alone. For the reports that place the governor in the senatorial gossip also say that Mrs. Pinchot will travel along on the same platform in quest of a seat in Congress.
Pinchot is regarded frankly in Washington official circles as a first-class political pest because of his "home dry" ideas on prohibition.
Prohibition is a question the vast majority of public men prefer to have left strictly alone.
Politicians Uncertain
The great mass of politicians are decidedly uncertain of how their home folk would line up if the proposition was put to a test at the polls. Consequently they shrink from voting on it, they refuse to talk about it and they shiver when they hear anybody else discussing it, lest they be dragged in.
Yet it's a subject Pinchot is digging into continually. If he treated it as a problem of his own, in his capacity as governor of the Keystone State, it wouldn't be so bad, but he persistently presents it as a national issue.
He nagged the late President Harding with it to the limit of his endurance and now it appears President Coolidge's turn has come.
An irritating feature of it is that administration advisors were just thinking the president had succeeded in getting the prohibition "bug" off his hands by cleverly announcing that the federal government can't possibly suppress bootlegging—that its job ends with the prevention of smuggling and illicit warehouses—that state, county and city authorities must look after those who actually sell the stuff to its "ultimate consumers."
"Wise Ones" Pleased
The "wise ones" interpreted this as amounting to a local option declaration, since it was obvious that local officials would provide their own communities with just the amount of enforcement they wanted—no less and no more.
Now Pinchot's plans to come before this state and country with a "home dry" platform tears things wide open in more ways than one.
In the first place, Pinchot is far from a "regular" Republican. He wants to take his team away from Senator George Wharton Pepper, who is a Congressman I. T. McFadden, another "regular," would be weeded out of the House of Representatives if Mrs. Pinchot should win, too.
At first thought, it may seem as if the Pinchots couldn't win on a dry platform in wet Pennsylvania. Still, the husband managed to get himself elected Governor.
Good Campaigners
He's a hard fighter, and he and his wife, who is a good campaigner, would make a spectacular fight. Moreover, Senator Pepper has another rival in Congressman W. S. Vare, and the contest a triangular character may count in Pinchot's favor.
As for the 1936 Republican presidential nomination, it isn't much of a secret that President Coolidge wants that once more for himself.
Hence he looks with little enthusiasm on Gov. Pinchot's scheme to boost himself in Senate prominence where the lightning will have a better chance to strike him.
Besides, win or lose, the governor will create a great hullabaloo over dry law enforcement, he may succeed in making a recognized big party issue of it, and then nobody can tell what will happen.

'HEAD SQUEEZERS'
TO BE SOUGHT OUT
IN SOUTH AMERICA

LONDON, April 11.—(AP)—Efforts to solve the mystery of the "human head squeezers," a tribe of which almost nothing is known and which lives in the wilds of the mountains between the main Amazon basin and the northern Andes, is to be one of the aims of an exploring expedition to South America to be made next summer by Dr. William M. McGovern, one of England's most daring anthropologists. Dr. McGovern, who was born in Brooklyn, N. Y., visited Lhasa, the forbidden city of Tibet, disguised as a Buddhist monk, last year, and has been making expeditions in various parts of the world in the interest of anthropological research work.

Possess Mines
The "human head squeezers" who have a way of reducing the heads of their victims to the size of a person's first, according to Dr. McGovern, also are supposed to be the possessors of gold and diamond mines in their native haunts just to the north of the Amazon jungle. The Londoner plans to spend seven to ten months in their midst, studying their habits and customs. No white man has ever solved the process of how heads are reduced in size without so much as disfiguring any of the victim's features and in the interest of science Dr. McGovern hopes to be able to overcome this riddle in the course of his explorations of this tribe and its haunts.
To Leave in May
Dr. McGovern plans to leave London early in May and in the trip across the Andes will cover parts of Brazil, Colombia, Ecuador and Peru.

Women of England
Roused by Dress
With Bird Feathers

LONDON, April 11.—(AP)—Use of stuffed humming birds for dress purposes in dress has aroused the ire of the Royal Society for the Protection of Birds, which issued an appeal recently to women, urging them to abstain from wearing the feathers of eagles, birds of paradise, herons and other rare species in the name of humanity and common sense. Importation of the plumage of these birds and others is prohibited by an act of parliament passed in 1921.
There is a tremendous illegitimate traffic in the plumage of these rare birds, not only in England, but in the United States and other parts of the world, according to statements made at the annual meeting of the society in London, when ways and means were discussed to put an end to this business. A proposal was made to form an international committee under the league of nations, and the Duchess of Somerset likened to say-ages the women who adorned themselves with these contraband feathers.
Mrs. Fox Pitt made a striking speech, in which she startled the members by announcement that but recently she had seen an evening gown with stuffed humming birds all over it. She counted them, she said, and was astonished to ascertain that 127 of the little creatures had been used for the "creation."
Another dress described by Mrs. Pitt required the skins of 14 birds of paradise to be sewed into the material.

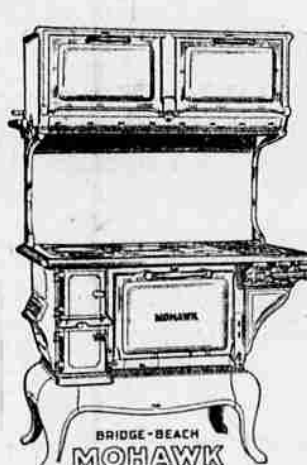

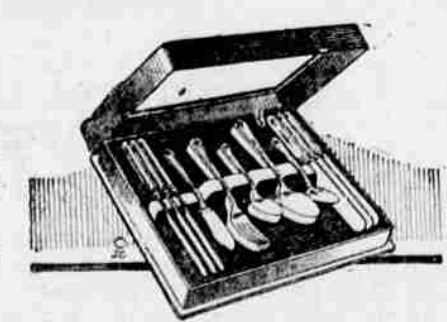

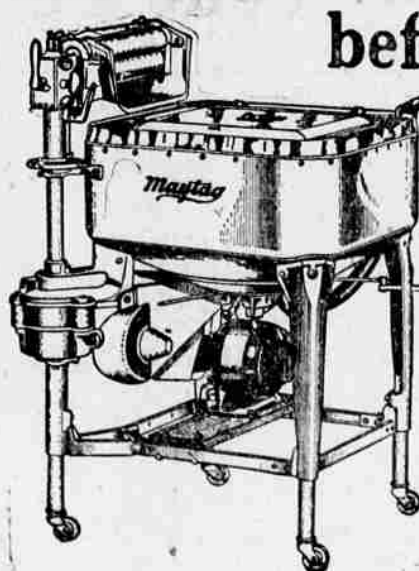
