

**7 AUTO CRASHES

**BIDS ARE ASKED
ON WORK IN LANE**

SALEM, Ore., April 11.—At a meeting of the state highway commission to be held in Portland, April 23 and 24, bids will be opened on the following projects:

Lane county—Bischo section of the Willamette valley. Florence highway; 2.75 miles of grading and surfacing.

Lincoln county—Newport-Agate beach section of the Roosevelt coast highway; 2.51 miles of grading.

Douglas county—Paving approaches to the H. A. Booth bridge on the Pacific highway north of Roseburg; .54 mile of concrete paving.

Benton county—Embankment approach to the new bridge over the Willamette river at Albany; 27 mile of embankment construction.

Douglas county—Gardiner section of the Roosevelt coast highway; 2.72 miles of grading and 1.74 miles of surfacing.

Yamhill county—Bee ranch-Dolph section of the McMinnville-Tillamook highway; .78 mile of grading and trestle construction.

Douglas county—A bridge over the Umpqua river on a county road at Elkton.

This project requires the removal of the old steel bridge, at Winchester and the re-erection of two spans on concrete piers, the placing of a new timber deck and approaches.

A bridge over the south Umpqua river on a county road near Dilard. This project requires the removal of the old steel span at Oakland, its re-erection, together with the third span of the old steel bridge now at Winchester, upon concrete piers, and the placing of a new timber on the deck and approaches.

Lane county—A bridge over the McKenzie river on the McKenzie highway near the present site of the present Hendricks bridge.

**Winter Wheat Crop
In Oregon Will be
Smallest in Years**

PORTLAND, Ore., April 11.—The Oregon winter wheat crop in 1925 will be the smallest in many years, owing to the heavy winter kill. While much of the area has been reseeded to spring wheat, the normally lighter yield of the spring crop will tend to make the total wheat production for the state even lower than the light crop of 1924, said F. L. Kent, statistician of the United States department of agriculture today in the April crop report.

While the whole effect of the winter killing of fall seeded wheat has not yet been determined, it seems probable that more than one-half of the Oregon acreage seeded last fall has been either reseeded to spring wheat or other spring sown crops, which, the condition of the remaining acreage is probably the lowest in the history of large scale wheat growing in the state, the percentage figure being placed at 55.0 per cent of normal, he added.

**Rights to Water
Are Relinquished**

SALEM, Ore., April 11.—The Pacific Power and Light company today filed with State Engineer Rhea Luter a relinquishment of its water rights on White river, Wasco county, in favor of settlers on the upper river who want the water for livestock or for domestic purposes. The company had a prior right covering practically the full flow of the stream.
