one more horse has been built," Rev. Mr. Redfern stated. Many families live in one or two rooms, and physical and moral deterioration cannot but result, he said.

The Liverpool minister is hopeful for the future, however, and cited the sentiment favoring international understanding which is growing among the English youth.

"Never was the peace sentiment so strong as it is today," he said. Of the League of Nations, he said, "I am tremendously keen about the idea, in spite of certain defects which I hope will be remedied."

Rev. Mr. Redfern is touring the country in the interests of the Unitarian church movement and will leave today for Salem and Portland.

A large crowd of Eugene Unitarians assembled at a banquet in the tea room of the Osburn hotel last night in honor of Dr. Redfern and Will L. Barnard of Boston. Rev. Frank Fay Eddy, pastor of the local Unitarian church, presided at the meeting.
