NEW LOWELL TO BE OPENED SOON

(Continued from page one) of the ramp on the west side, with the men's smoking room off the opposite landing on the east side. The manager's office will have access to the foyer, through the ramp wall. Balcony Attracts The balcony entrance is from the ramp in the foyer. Grilled openings on the way up give a view of the foyer from above. The balconies will seat as many as the lower floor, with the same perfect vision provided. All seats will be heavily upholstered, and the ventilating effect will be the same as downstairs. All sides will be heavily carpeted and lighted with Isis lights. Two great 12 by 20 feet fabric paintings are being put on each wall of the lower floor, in arches reaching clear up into the coiled ceiling. The auditorium is to be lighted by five wall baskets on each wall, near the ceiling. Each basket has an alcove backing with three colors and white lights in each basket. Each color may be used alone, or in combination

with others, so that a widely varied lighting effect may be obtained. Each circuit is an separate dimmer. The walls and ceiling are in blends of grey, canstone and ivory, with a wide band frieze. The chairs in both auditorium and balcony will be specially upholstered. Garden Effect Pretty Organ grille are in arches at each side of the big stage. The grilles are of wrought iron, highlighted in gold. A dainty garden is being installed beneath each organ chamber. A wrought iron rail runs between the pillar columns, and a colored lighting effect is used in the gardens. The organ is a specially designed Wurlitzer three-manual affair, nearly twice as large as the big Wurlitzer in the Rex theater. The organ chambers are on either side of the stage, the music coming through the grilles and blending in the center, with an entirely different effect that is not given by the ordinary organ. The three-manual console is in the center of the pit in front of the stage. The pit is large enough to seat a large orchestra. The stage was constructed in size to accommodate any road attraction, vaudeville or musical organization. The stage is hung with orange silk plush lambrian, or grand draps, and tormentoes, or side wings, with a blue-grey draw curtain and metallic backing in front of the screens. On the stage is a huge switchboard, with

complete dimmer control, making it possible to dim off or bring up each circuit separately. A new type of footlights and hanging spot border lights make possible the latest and most novel lighting effects on the stage. All curtains are to be operated by motors, controlled both from the stage and protection room. A large fly gallery is on the east wall. Completely furnished and heated dressing rooms are in the basement, below the stage. The ventilation of the theater is to be one of the biggest features. A large cold air intake from the stage wall, near the roof, draws the air down through a cleaner, through impulse heating coils, by a ten-foot fan. The air is then forced up and across the ceiling of the auditorium, and out into the theater in four grilles in back of the balcony. A new type of footlights and hanging spot border lights make possible the latest and most novel lighting effects on the stage. 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
