PITCHER "LEFTY" GROVES, for whom Connie Mack is reported to have parted with a hundred thousand and simoleons, has already shown flashes of greatness despite his inability to finish either of his first two starts.

In his second game of the season, pitched against the Boston Red Sox, he pitched three and one-third innings of erratic yet brilliant baseball.

One feature of major league ball that is certain to trouble Groves for a time, is the wait 'em out tactics the players will adopt when batting against him.

Groves came to the majors with the reputation of being wild, also having a tendency to have one bad inning, in which lack of control would undo a perfectly pitched game up to that time.

Groves will probably find himself in the hole more times than he has the edge on the batter, because of the keen eye possessed by most major leaguers and their refusal to bite at bad balls.

Until Groves acquires control that will enable him to get the edge on the batter, he is going to be forced to do a lot of pitching.

His case is no different from that which confronts all recent pitchers who lack a reputation of being wild. He should overcome it.

Regardless of where the Chicago White Sox finish in the American League race it is already apparent that the team is going to hustle, a pleasing feature of baseball.

Having the good will of his players means that 50 per cent of a manager's troubles are immediately eliminated.

The Chicago White Sox are for Eddie Collins to a man. His brilliant career as a player inspires them and the regard they have for him as a man makes every player give his best from start to finish.

There seems to be a greater dash to Collins' play today than ever before in his long career. He is showing the spirit he wants his players to emulate.
