GOVERNOR SPEAKS AT JACKSONVILLE MUSEUM OPENING

MEDFORD, Ore., April 29.—At the official opening of the Jacksonville museum of pioneer relics Monday night in the historic old U. S. hotel attended by 300 people from all parts of Jackson county, Governor Walter M. Pierce was the principal speaker and guest of honor at the banquet.

The chief executive in a ten-minute talk praised Jacksonville for its display of community spirit and lauded the efforts of Governor Pierce made mention of the threatened recall against him by the sportsmen, and laughed about it.

TOPOGRAPHERS TO RESUME LABORS

NEW YORK, April 29.—Four hundred government topographers are taking the field this month to resume annual work upon the \$50,000,000 map of the United States, already 45 years in the making, which the last congress decided must be hurried to completion within the next 20 years.

The American engineering council, representing 28 engineering societies said today, that this, the greatest cartographic panorama ever made of the country, is being produced in such detail that it will account for every acre and will even show every farmhouse.

The vast job is only about one-third done. The map, called "The Topographic Atlas of the United States," if spread out in a single sheet would resemble the "big top" of a circus tent and would cover a solid acre.

However, it is being divided into 60,000 sheets for convenience. The American engineering council says the map gives both elevations and distances and newer sections of the great work similarly show submarine "contours" on ocean and lake coasts.

PAIR OF GLASSES MAY END MYSTERY

GARY, Ind., April 29.—A pair of eyeglasses for a middle aged man, a woman's grey suede left shoe and a chart of her teeth were the keys held today by authorities investigating the death of an unidentified girl whose dismembered, burned, and bullet-riddled body was found Sunday near Chesterton.

A possibility that solution of the mystery hinged entirely on the eyeglasses, like that of the slaying of Bobby Franks by Nathan Leopold and Richard Loeb, was considered by officials in a lengthy conference last night.

The shoe with one strap burned off was found by a police dog about 300 feet from the spot where the body was found.

The dog followed a trail to a small swampy lake a short distance away where authorities believe the missing legs and right arm of the girl might be found when the lake is pumped dry.

Tracing of any dental work done on her teeth was started when the chart of the girl's mouth was made. A partial identification of the body as that of the wife of a Gary railroad employe was upset when it was learned that a letter was received from her from Fernia, Ill., Monday.

Her husband who had been held for questioning was released.

New Potatoes are Reported Plentiful

CHICAGO, April 29.—New potatoes are twice as plentiful as a year ago. The United States bureau of agricultural economics reported today that shipments of new potatoes to market in the last week have increased to 1350 carloads, nearly double the output for the previous week, as well as for the corresponding period last year.

The abundant arrivals of new potatoes from the south are fast pushing old potatoes into the background. Texas sent forward 300 carloads and Louisiana 35.

Stalled Automobile Found to Be Still
