Man of Honest Report, Full of Holy Ghost and Wisdom Seems to Have Been Precursor of Paul, Examiner Finds

The International Uniform Sunday School Lesson for May 10: Philip and the Ethiopian Treasurer.—Acts 8:26-40.

Philip was not the Apostle of the Gentiles, but was one of the seven men of honest report, full of the Holy Ghost and wisdom, who were appointed in the early church to administer the funds and care for the widows, etc. (Acts 6:3-5); thus leaving the Apostle free for their work of prayer and spiritual ministrations. Philip was another of the seven men of honest report.



TEXT: Acts 8:26-40.

And the angel of the Lord spake unto Philip, saying, Arise, and go toward the south, unto the way that goeth down from Jerusalem unto Gaza, which is desert. And he arose and went; and behold, a man of Ethiopia, a eunuch of great authority under Candace, queen of the Ethiopians, who had charge of all her treasure, and had come to Jerusalem for to worship.

And he commanded the chariot to stand still; and they went down both into the water, both Philip and the eunuch; and he baptized him. And when they were come up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord caught away Philip, that the eunuch saw him no more; and he went on his way rejoicing.
