ferred upon him under the grain futures act to bring about a condition where the quotations in future trading will more accurately reflect the prices incident to supply and demand. Can Be Done.

It can be done, it was said, by appropriate action on the part of the board of trade and the promulgation of rules calculated to prevent speculative trading. The suggestion was advanced that a role limiting the spread in daily quotation would have this effect.

Secretary Jardine feels that in the event of the failure by the exchange designated at contract markets to take some effective measures he will be obliged, in the public interest to suggest additional legislation giving to the department authority to meet the situation effectively.

The investigation covered the period of trading beginning January 2, at which time May deliveries closed at \$1.76 1-4 and ending April 3, when they closed at \$1.38 1-2. Daily fluctuations, the report said, were wide, the greatest range being noted on March 13 and March 30, when the range was respectively 13 1/4 and 13 1/2.

KLAMATH FALLS, Ore., May 13.—Sheriff's deputies today were still without clues as to the whereabouts of the safe-blowers who broke open the safe of the Klamath Supply company at Chiloquin, reservation town, early yesterday.

The yeags obtained about \$100 in cash, but are declared by officers of the company to have overlooked more than \$6000 which was in an inner drawer of the strong box. Oregon Bureau in Wyoming Planned

PORTLAND, Ore., May 13.—(Special)—Will J. Roberts, high school principal at Ontario, Oregon, has been selected to manage an "Oregon Bureau" to be maintained at Green River, Wyoming, by the land settlement and publicity departments of the Oregon development fund during the coming tourist season. It was announced by W. G. Ide, manager of the land settlement department.

The Wyoming office will be the fourth established by the land settlement department outside of Portland, the previous three including the Los Angeles bureau, and the two "gateway" offices at Ashland and Ontario, Oregon.

Eighteen new settlers coming from six states and one Canadian province, were located in Oregon during the first ten days of this month, according to Ide. These settlers purchased 230 acres of land and invested a total of \$37,945.

MARINE CITY, Mich., May 13.—With bats badly battered, their shoes sorely worn and their feet weary from running, girls of the Marine City and Yale, Mich., high schools, ended by mutual consent a baseball game here yesterday at the end of the fifth inning. The score stood 65 to 18 in favor of Yale.

BORER OPPOSED
WASHINGTON, May 13.—Under the slogan "board feet or bored timber," the bureau of entomology of the department of agriculture, has declared vigorous warfare through motion pictures and an education campaign against pinhole borers, worm hole borers, pine sawyers, ambrosia beetles and other animated gimlets. The annual damage done by these borers is estimated at \$40,000,000.

Huge Moonshine Plant Uncovered

PORTLAND, Ore., May 13.—A moonshine plant equipped with two 250-gallon stills was uncovered by federal and state officers near the Willamette river six miles east of Newberg Monday night and later destroyed. It was so protected by cliffs and brush that the posse, in breaking through, made so much noise the operators got away. Much mash, 1600 pints of bottled moonshine and 200 gallons in kegs were seized. The plant represented a \$10,000 investment, officers said.

Correction is Made By Taxicab Manager

A mistake in an announcement from the city hall yesterday that A. J. Korb, who paid a fine of \$5 for driving a taxicab, was an operator for the Black and White Taxi company, was made today by Arthur W. Strickland, manager of the company. The driver mentioned is not connected in any way with his company, states the manager.

"We have operated taxicabs in Lane county for seven years," said Mr. Strickland, "and have never had an accident with any of our taxicabs or for that matter, with any of our good cars. We think this is too good a record to be jeopardized by an erroneous report."

Slight Earthquake Shock is Recorded

CHICAGO, May 13.—A slight earthquake shock was recorded at 6:35 a. m., central standard time, on the weather bureau seismograph at the University of Chicago today. The disturbance lasted only one minute, five seconds and the record did not indicate direction or distance.

METROPOLIS, Ill., May 13.—A distinct shock lasting several seconds believed to have been caused by an earthquake, was felt in this vicinity early today.
