

### FURNITURE BIDS FOR NEW SCHOOLS ASKED BY BOARD

Bids on desks and other furniture and floor material for the two new junior high schools, the Roosevelt at Seventeenth avenue east and Agate street, and the Wilson at Twelfth avenue west and Jefferson street, are requested by school district number 4, announces D. H. Jones, clerk of the school board. A total of 600 desks for students, 25 for teachers, 30 chairs for teachers, 1200 portable chairs in sections of two or four, and battleship linoleum for all stairs and corridors will be required for the buildings.

The two structures will be officially opened next fall, at the beginning of the next school term, it is announced. The Roosevelt school will have 12 rooms, with a capacity of 200, and the Wilson school, with 22 rooms, can ultimately care for 600.

Many Students Expected.

The number of students expected to register will far exceed the expectations of the board at the time the buildings were planned, believes Mr. Jones. The buildings will care for an increase for several years, it is stated. At least 300 students are expected next fall at the Roosevelt school, and 500 at the Wilson school, it is said.

The seventh, eighth and ninth grades will be installed in each building. This will take away the ninth grade from the senior high school, and will relieve the congestion there.

Miss Margaret Halverson, now principal of the Condon school, will take charge of the Roosevelt junior high, and S. D. Eaton, now head of the Frances Willard, will be principal of the Wilson. The teachers have also been selected for both buildings.

The specifications for the furniture of both buildings is as follows: Eighty number one pupils' desks; 125 number 2; 170 number 3; 125 number 4; 70 number 5; 20 number 6; 25 teachers' desks; 30 teachers' chairs; 1200 portable chairs in sections of two or four; and battleship linoleum for all stairs and corridors.

Both buildings are of substantial reinforced concrete construction. The Roosevelt building, of Spanish type and decorations is attracting particular attention, it is stated. It will be quite lively in appearance, with the exterior finished in cream color, the windows trimmed in greenish blue and the roof painted bright red.

"The buildings look nice from the outside," says Mr. Jones, "but the inside is even nicer. Every modern convenience is found within, and the buildings are up-to-date in every way."

F. Manson White was architect for both structures.

B. Parks.

"While we regard such action as most unfortunate, we are not going to engage in anything of a controversial nature in regard to it," stated Mayor Parks today. "The financial status of the city of Eugene is one of the best among cities of its size on the coast, and there is positively nothing to be alarmed over in regards to the Clearing house action."

Mayor Parks, it is learned, is among those who have taken up a block of the warrants. He says the city expects to continue to issue these warrants to contractors, who will either hold them or dispose of them to persons who are willing to make the investment.
