American Writer Defends Youth; Campus Conditions Better Than People Think

"Moral conditions in the average American university are not as bad as they are painted," Charles Albert Selden, special writer for the Ladies' Home Journal and formerly foreign correspondent for the New York Evening Post, said yesterday in an interview on the general aspects of a college education.

Mr. Selden, who is making a survey of the principal colleges and universities in various sections of the country, is at present engaged in collecting data from the leading colleges on the coast, to be used in the construction of a series of articles in the social and moral conditions existing among American institutions of higher learning.

TEN THOUSAND HOMELESS AS RESULT OF FIRE

Railroad Train Buried in Collapse of Tunnel Near Ashiya

Toyo-Oka and Small Towns Nearby Are Menaced By Fire

TOKYO, May 23.—(AP)—The department of communications announced today that more than 200 persons are believed to be dead and several hundred were injured in the earthquake and fire at Toho-Oka.

The Mairu naval station 50 miles from Toyo-Oka, is preparing for relief of the earthquake survivors.

Troops to Maintain Order The destroyer Enoki and the cruiser Kasuga have been ordered to the scene.

Damage Not Estimated The authorities here have not been able to obtain accurate estimates of the number of casualties or the amount of damage done.

MANY HOUSES COLLAPSE OSAKA, May 23.—(AP)—Two houses were reported collapsed and numerous fires were raging today in the vicinity of Toyo-Oka.

The earthquake which sent terrified residents into the streets forcing a repatriation of the Tokyo disaster of 1923.

Reports received here by the regular newspapers report the Toyo-Oka postoffice has collapsed and the railroad station burning.
