

SECURITY PACT CONCORD VIEWED

France and Germany covering her interests in the security question.

PRINCIPLES LAID DOWN

GENEVA, June 8.—(AP)—The all-Great Britain yesterday will lay down certain principles as the basis of the negotiation of a specific text. These principles include the creation of a Rhine pact of neutral guarantees which will be supplemented by similar treaties between France and Germany and Belgium and Germany and Poland and Czechoslovakia. The country resorting to force and attacking another would be considered an aggressor. If Germany attacked Poland in defiance of the arbitration arrangements for instance then France would have the right to go to Poland's assistance.

This is not considered a likely contingency as Germany has gone on record as pledged not to use force, but to accept arbitration of her international disputes. Nevertheless, France insists upon the right to cross Germany to protect Poland as an added guarantee for Germany's eastern neighbors.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT GIVEN

LONDON, June 9.—(AP)—The British government today gave official acknowledgement to the Franco-British agreement on the reply to Germany's security pact proposal, announced at Geneva yesterday. The British government issued a statement emphasizing that the proposed pact is one of mutual assistance. The statement said that Great Britain has guaranteed to protect both sides of the Rhine, and therefore to assist either Germany or France against aggression of the other. The abandonment by Great Britain of her long standing policy of isolation from continental affairs is a concession to the peace and security of Europe, the statement said.

POINTS ARE LISTED

PARIS, June 9.—(AP)—The points of agreement between France and Great Britain on the reply to Germany's security pact proposal are: First—The pact no longer presents the appearance of assistance to Germany by France to Belgium, but a firm decision by Great Britain to defend her own security from the Rhine and the Scheldt. Second—The interests of France's allies, the poles and Czechoslovakia have been guarded, because France retains the right to cross the demilitarized Rhine zone in case of a threat to Germany over her eastern frontiers. Third—The arbitration treaties which Germany has proposed to conclude with Prague and Warsaw and with Paris and Brussels and which must be negotiated at the same time as the security pact, will only affect differences arising in the future, that they cannot apply to questions of borders or other dispositions provided for in the peace treaties.

Americans Lose Balloon Contest

BRUSSELS, June 9.—(AP)—Both the American entrants are out of the balloon race for the Gordon-Bennett cup. The 8-14, with Lieutenant Ford and Lieutenant McCormick, landed near Dieppe, France, yesterday. The Goddard III piloted by Wade Van Arman was today considered disqualified because its pilot accepted aid when the balloon fell at sea. The three balloons which still were afloat from out of the 18 that started Sunday were the Grand Charles, French and the Belgian and Prince Leopold, Belgian. The Aero club at Brussels discredited rumors that Pilot DeMuyter, of the Belgian, had been killed landing in England. The French balloon Picardie landed at Anzeville, France, it was reported today.
