

### MUSIC CLUBS TO CHOOSE OFFICERS

PORTLAND, Ore., June 10.—(AP)—Politics came to the fore today in the biennial convention of the National Federation of Music Clubs with the report of the nominating committee, proposing members of the board of directors. The delegates will vote on directors all day tomorrow, and Friday the selection of officers will be announced. Candidates mentioned for the presidency are Mrs. Cecil Frankel of Los Angeles, and Mrs. Edgar Stillman Kelley of Oxford, Ohio. The education department had the floor today at the convention.

Mrs. William Arms Fisher, of Boston, national chairman of the educational department, had charge of the morning session, at which reports of various educational activities were presented.

The world premiere of "The Echo," one-act American opera, last night, the outstanding musical event of the convention, was declared by critics to be an unqualified success. An audience that packed the auditorium heard the opera and also the prize symphonic poem "The Pit and Pendulum" the latter conducted by its composer, Edgar Stillman Kelley.

"The Echo," says Susie Aubrey Smith of the Telegram, "was a hundred per cent American production—composed by an American, the roles created by American artists, and the opera presented by an American organization in an American city. Without taking into consideration the comparatively few rehearsals which were possible, with full cast, chorus and orchestra, and the relatively small financial outlay made for the entire production, the performance may be characterized as remarkably fine. Frank Patterson has composed some very beautiful and very difficult music for his opera—and the manner in which both the singers and the orchestra surmounted its technical difficulties is greatly to their credit."

they demand a planner and a creator and a law giver. Reason cannot go so far as to discover these laws and plans and created things without going a step further to the creator, discerning some of his attributes by the things he has done.

"I was asked the other day if I believed in a future life, and what proof there was of such life. I replied that it took faith to apprehend and believe in a future life. But there are ample proofs of a future life if we care to weigh them and the fundamental one around which all others center is the resurrection of Jesus Christ. If Christ rose from the dead, it proves that there is a future life. What evidence is there of his resurrection? This desk behind which I stand this building in which I speak, a institution in which you are seated and every Christian church in existence and every Christian institution and every Christian in the universe now and since the day of the resurrection, is evidence of the resurrection. It was this incident which transformed the 11 disciples from fleeing cowards into inspired prophets who assailed the world single-handed and sought in a generation to convert all men to Christianity and to a belief in the resurrection. It was faith in this resurrection that enabled men who had fled from mere rebuke or censure to calmly face a martyr's death.

"To believe in such a transformation of the disciples without an adequate cause requires greater credulity than to believe in the resurrection, and when they themselves asserted the resurrection of Jesus Christ as the cause of their inspiration they furnished the explanation of their conduct and gave evidence of the truth of their assertion.

"If we accept as a basis of life the first verse of the first chapter of Genesis, the first verse of the 23rd psalm, and the first two sentences of the Lord's prayer, we shall have in those declarations, made hundreds of years apart, a sure foundation for investigation into the truth of religion as revealed in the bible and in nature. These verses are as follows:

"In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth."

"The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want."

"Our father who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth and as it is in heaven."

"And if we are willing to regulate our conduct according to the truth thus discovered, we cannot go far wrong, for it is written, 'he that doeth the will of God shall know of the doctrine whether it be true or false.'"
