NEW YORK, June 12.—(AP)—While John T. Scopes, high school teacher, was returning today from New York to Dayton, Tenn., his counsel were brushing up on the intricacies of the rise of man and there was much discussion of the part radicals are playing in arrangements for the defense of Scopes on a charge of violating the state law against teaching evolution.

Later Scopes, as guest of honor at a dinner of 300 so-called liberals and radicals said: "I have met here in New York the most lovable bunch of people I ever knew—those who have taken up my case."
