

### LEGION MEMBERS LEAVE BY AUTO FOR CONVENTION

Several automobile loads of American Legion members left Eugene today for the state convention at Prineville this week-end. The vanguard of the local delegation, led by George E. Love, state chief of state of the 40 and 8 societies and commander of the drum and bugle corps, went yesterday. The trip is being made by the McKenzie pass, where automobile traffic continues uninterrupted, although some of the cars got stuck in the mud at the summit of the mountain, it is reported.

Several legion delegates from other towns in the Willamette valley passed through Eugene this morning on their way up the McKenzie highway from Oregon. City stopped over in Eugene last night on their way to Prineville, traveling aboard a marine auto truck.

Between 15 and 20 drum corps will compete in the state contest which the Eugene post expects to win. It is said that in the last few weeks, their commander declares, and the organization is planning to give Eugene a hard run for its money. Prizes aggregating \$300 are being offered for the winners in the contest, and the Salem men are using \$150 they won in Portland last week to pay their expenses on the trip. They will dress in a full outfit of convict uniforms.

Eugene will be represented by approximately 75 men before the convention ends, is the estimate of George Love. A large number are going over for the week-end only, although from 40 to 50 will be able to attend the entire convention.

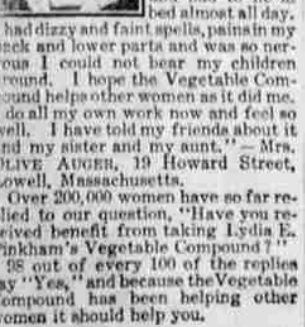

Professor Bressman found all of the fields pure as to variety, reports Mr. Fleicher, but because all have some vetch and oats admixed, this will prevent the listing of the seed as certified seed.
