The boy is going to keep his own private "log" of his activities, radio giving a boy's eye view of the Polar circle should be a human document to compare almost with Marco Polo's travels.

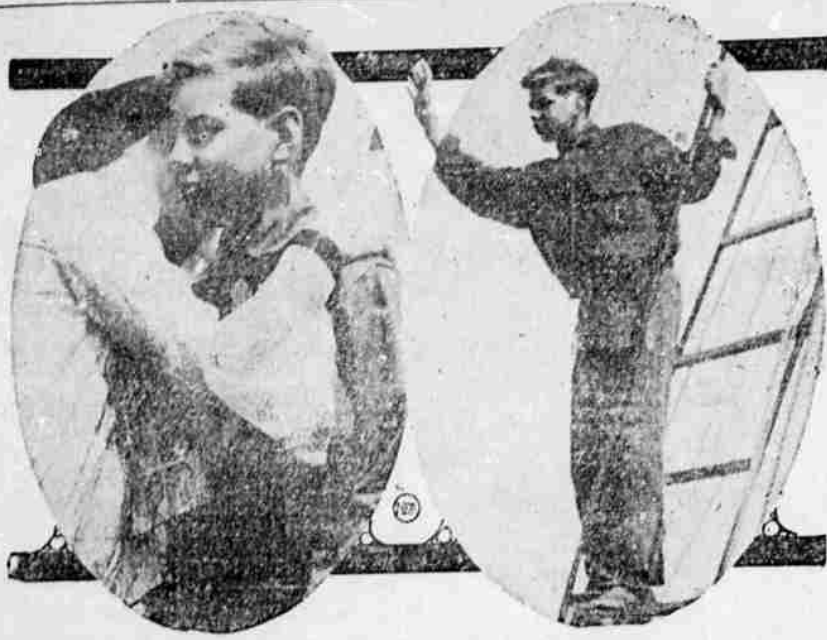

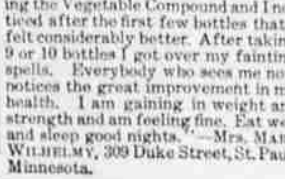
Woodcraft Votes Down Affiliations

ASSOCIATED PRESS GETS QUAKE STORY UNDER DIFFICULTY

SANTA BARRABA, Cal., July 1.—From a thirty shack, eight by 14 feet "luminated" with five small empty packing cases and a make-do table of discarded boards to which an Associated Press wire had been hastily hooked the first direct news of Santa Barbara's disaster went out to the world shortly after noon.

These emergency headquarters, manned by staff writers and telegraph operators from a steady stream of news on the seaside remainder through the day and into the night, checking and re-checking facts of dead and injured, estimating and re-estimating from the best available data the material loss to the community.

From here the staffmen ranged the streets from the Alhambra hotel to the waterfront in never-ending expeditions to get the facts to the outside world.

When night fell a new problem faced them—what about light? For the wires had to be kept going so that those who read the morning papers comfortable between cups of coffee might know a city of 31,000 had fared during and after one of the outstanding catastrophes of the Pacific coast.

The obstacle of lack of light, due to the collapse of the electric power house was surmounted by marking a automobile up to the "docks" of the "Associated Press bureau" and springing a wire with a tiny bulb attached from the machine's battery to the operating table.

Across the street the city firemen had established a lunch counter and between cups of steaming black coffee, the sweat-bathed begrimed staffmen of the Associated Press commended the story of Santa Barbara's disaster and her heroic plans for reconstruction.
