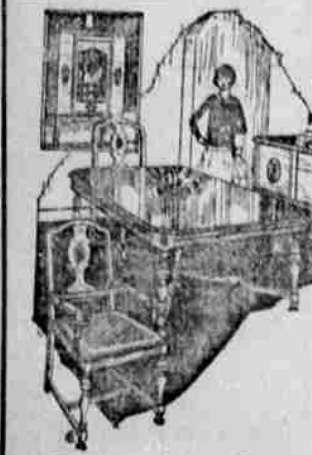

SPRINGFIELD MAN KNEW LIEUT. LUKE

A. T. (Tony) Graves of Springfield served overseas with the same outfit as Lieut. Frank Luke, aviator whose story is in "Aces Up" story now running in The Guard. "I was a mechanic with the 27th aerodrome squadron at the time Lieut. Luke was killed on the Verdun front," said Mr. Graves, "and another mechanic and I repaired his plane when he had to take a forced landing a few days before he was killed." Mr. Graves said that Lieut. Luke was "surely a game fellow." Three balloons and two planes were dropped by the ace in a single patrol, and in 12 days Mr. Graves knew him to have dropped 18 planes and balloons. "Frequently when out on patrol and flying with a number of other planes in a V formation, he would slip out through the clouds and go off working single-handed," Mr. Graves said. "For that they used to take him off flying for a day or two, and how he used to hate it. Then they would let him go on again, and he would do it just as before."

Mrs. Eva J. Smith, 70, died at her home, 878 Alameda street, Sunday, Feb. 12, at 5:15 p. m. Mrs. Smith was born in Michigan, June 21, 1867, and has lived in Eugene for 18 years. 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\$3 AUTO LICENSE FEE IS OPPOSED

County Judge C. P. Barnard, voicing opposition to the proposed \$3 auto license fee in Oregon, was the speaker at the luncheon of the Kiwanis club Monday at the Osburn hotel.

Judge Barnard cited facts and figures concerning road construction in the state, and declared that if a property tax on automobiles was introduced in place of the present license fee, the cost to the automobile owner would be as high as at present, without the benefits now enjoyed.

A property levy of approximately 4 1/2 mills would result if the \$3 fee was voted, he said. Roy Booth spoke briefly on the proposed chamber of commerce industrial survey.

The proposed junior college plan for the University of Oregon which would replace the present "group requirement" plan, will be discussed Monday evening at a colloquium meeting of the university faculty at 7:30 o'clock in room 110 Johnson hall.
