"Was it a matter of the Sinclair bond discussed at that meeting?"
"Oh, yes, that was before the bonds were given."

"You know that Sinclair was involved. Won't you tell us why you did not come forward sooner and tell the committee of the Sinclair bonds?"

"Well, would that have added anything?" Mellon said. "You had all the information and that all could have been added was a time. It was an incidental thing. What purpose would have been served by that? I could not have told about \$200,000 in bonds."

"You had reason to assume that the bonds Hays gave you were Continental bonds," Nye said.

"The bonds were returned," Mellon said. "It never occurred to me that there was any reason for me to tell about it. I had no responsibility with the republican national committee or with Mr. Sinclair."

WASHINGTON, March 13.—(AP)—Will H. Hays, former postmaster, told the senate today that he was at the senate Tsapot Dome committee and testified that he had sought to have Secretary Mellon and William M. Butler, chairman of the republican national committee, accept bonds from him in 1923 and in their stead contribute toward wiping out the committee's debt.

Mellon and Butler previously had testified they had rejected Hays' proposition.
