ACES UP

One of the most impressive imports which have come into this country from Europe in the past ten years has been the persistent propaganda which would have us believe that we failed in the air during the Great War. A comparison of that other propaganda which destroyed the huge merchant marine we built up to serve Europe's need, this invidious and plausible pressure to let us to discontinue our own efforts has had many supporters. Some of these supporters were venal; others were victims of the propaganda who should have known better than to believe or promulgate it.

The 4th of March, 1918, saw Rickenbacker at Villeneuve to join the newly organized 94th Squadron, in which the famous Major Raoul Lufbery was commanding officer. Two days later he made his first flight over the lines with Lufbery and Douglas Campbell, making the acquaintance of "Archie," the anti-aircraft gunner. There has also been a persistent attack upon the integrity of our aviation industry. During wide circulation was given to statements to the effect that new flying records had "stolen" over a billion dollars spent for airplane production and that "not a single American airplane had been sent to France." That is the American industry and the mechanics on the memories of the men who gave their lives for American aviation in the War, but it requires a detailed answer which cannot be given here. A summary of training won the most remarkable series of victories in the aerial records of the World War. They were Americans and they did the job in the American skies with courage and without regard to the cost.
