Stage Competition In State is Keen

SALEM, April 12.—(AP)—So keen has become competition between Pacific States, Inc., and the Southern Pacific Motor Transport company between Portland and Hillsboro that the two propose to operate 35 vehicles daily except Sunday between the

two points. The Pacific stages schedule on file with the public service commission is to become effective May 1, while the Southern Pacific schedule, also filed with the commission is to be effective May 1. Indeed the high school and university folk have already begun their plans. From now on, too, much time will be given over to planning May day festivals and then commencement. And while all these subjects seem to have little to do with a recipe

it shall be. So you see it's none too early to put your thinking cap and send us in a few suggestions to have on hand when the big call comes. The four recipes chosen this week follow:

Cold Meat Croquettes
One and three-fourths cups of cooked meat.
One teaspoon of celery salt.
One teaspoon of lemon juice.
One teaspoon finely chopped parsley.
One-half teaspoon of salt, a dash of pepper, a few drops of onion juice.
One cup of thick white sauce.
Mix all in the order given. Cool and shape, roll in beaten egg. Cover with fine crumbs. Cook in deep fat—Crisco—Duyck, Creswell, Oregon, Route 1.

Luncheon Casserole
Two tablespoons of fat.
One cup diced cooked potatoes.
One cup of diced onion.
One cup of tomato juice.
One-half teaspoon of salt.
One and one-half teaspoons of grated cheese.
One pimento.
Brown potatoes and onion in fat. Put into greased baking dish. Make sauce of tomatoes, thickened with flour and pour over potatoes. Cover with rice then grated cheese and shredded pimento. Bake in moderate oven for about 35 minutes.—Jeanne Morton, Cottage Grove, Oregon.

Spanish Pudding
One-fourth pound of spaghetti.
One can of tomato soup.
One can of chili meat.
Boil spaghetti in salt water until tender. Drain. Place layer in baking dish. Spread with chili meat. Place another layer of spaghetti until all is used. Pour the soup over. Bake 15 minutes.—Mrs. H. C. Porter, 2555 Nixon street, Eugene, Oregon.

Three eggs.
One cup of sugar.
Four tablespoons of baking powder.
One teaspoon of vanilla.
Take whites from eggs and beat well. Mix flour, sugar, baking powder together and sift five times. Sift milk and mix well. Fold in egg whites.—Mrs. J. E. Guiley, Lowell, Oregon.

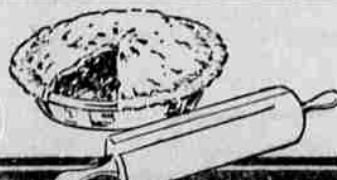
