on the ice around them was almost all the material which formed the cabin.

"Only a minute after the plunge. Noble and his companions cried passionately: 'Viva Italia!'"

"On the evening of May 30, about 12 kilometers northeast of Foyne island, Captain A. Mariano and Captain Filipp Zappi and the Swedish scientist, Dr. Finn Malmgren started with provisions for north cape. They intended to cover 10 kilometers a day.

"There were left with Noble the Czechoslovak scientist Prof. F. Dehounek, Lieut. A. Vidler, engineer Troiano, Chief Natale Cecconi and Giuseppe Biori, radio operator.

"The other members of the crew remained with the drifting dirigible. They have food enough for three months and are supplied with complete equipment.

"In the group with General Noble there are two injured, one of them is already convalescent. The other suffering from a leg injured below the knee, will recover eventually.

"General Noble said the ice had broken up a little and one lead was showing between the floes. He gave his position last night as 80 degrees 38 minutes north, 26 degrees 55 minutes east.

KINGS BAY, Spitzbergen, June 13.
—An encounter with polar bears was one of the most dramatic moments in last week's reconnaissance by Lieutenant Luetzow Holm who spent five days away from his base ship Hobby seeking the Italia, tied up by fog and gasoline shortage.

"Details of the adventure were brought to Kings Bay today by the ice breaker Braganza, which put in here for further provisions.

"When Lieutenant Holm and his companion, Pilot Myre, were forced to land at Brandy bay, because of fog, polar bears made their appearance while the pilots were in their sleeping bags. The bears displayed great curiosity about the plane, approached it where it rested on the ice edge and nosed all over it.

convention so far to hold the chairmanship of a committee.

She also holds the honor of being the first woman to address the convention from the platform. Temporary Chairman Feas called upon her to place the motion for the appointment of members for the credentials committee shortly after committee motions were in order during the morning.

Calmly undisturbed by the heat, the excess of manhood, and the questioning, Pohl called the roll of the tiny committee room. Mrs. Wilbrandt called the credentials group to order and with precision disposed of the roll call and the calling of the first case, a loud clear voice, long used in prosecuting federal prohibition cases, she ordered the room cleared of all but members of the committee, the contestants, and newspapermen and forthwith the room was cleared.

Fellow women supporters of Hoover who came to watch the most active member of their crew preside at what proved to be heated fights for more than 60 seats in the convention hall were smiled upon sweetly by the chairwoman, but were unceremoniously herded from the crowded little room along with the rest of the unofficial spectators.

Five in Rules Group
Of the other committees that met during the first afternoon, the rules and order of business committee boasted the largest representation of women, five women delegates being appointed to help conduct the business. Mrs. Julia M. Emery of Connecticut, Mrs. Sarah Anthoine, Maine; Mrs. Minnie H. Dwight, Massachusetts; Mrs. Marie Durey, North Dakota, and Mrs. Erick H. Johnson, Wisconsin, held up the feminine end of this committee.

The committee on permanent organization contained one woman, Mrs. M. J. Caples of Virginia, while the important resolutions committee had no feminine representation upon it.

The two other committees, whose members have been designated by delegation chairman, but whose duties will not begin until the purpose of the convention has been achieved, are those to notify the president and vice-president of their respective nominations.

Mrs. Henry J. Sharpe, Rhode Island; Mrs. L. R. Gates, Utah, and Mrs. Hugh Eldridge, Washington, are on the presidential committee. Elizabeth C. Verga, New Jersey; Mrs. Marian A. Shelley, New York; Mrs. Barbara R. Parkinson, North Dakota; Mrs. Hugh Clark, Ohio; Mrs. Thomas G. Hathaway, Washington; Mrs. John A. Thurnley, Utah, and Mrs. H. W. Clouche, Idaho, complete the vice-presidential notification committee.

Though no women sat in judgment on the resolutions committee, several appeared before it seeking to have their pet planks inserted in the platform. Mrs. Jane Norman Smith, chairman of the national council and Mrs. Frances Roberts of the industrial council of the national women's party, both spoke in favor of a woman's equal rights constitutional amendment plank.

Mrs. James W. Morrison of Chicago spoke for the five-point plank sponsored by the league of women voters and Mrs. Frederick Barker of Boston, represented the national education association in its effort to have the party adopt a plank creating a department of education.

The feminine farm element was represented when air farmers' wives joined their husbands in the demonstration of several hundred growers.
