BERRY SUPPLY IS GOOD; PRICE LOWER

The local crop of red raspberries is coming in well now and next week should find the best of the season in. Prices continue to drop, the berries being generally quoted at \$2 a crate Thursday morning, a drop of 25 cents or so from Wednesday. Canning should be well under way next week.

The logans and strawberries continue unchanged, with the former showing slightly weaker tendencies. Heavy rains are somewhat higher on the local produce market, being listed at 18 to 20 cents Thursday. The light rains are the same at 10 to 14 cents. Sprinklers are a cent lower at 21 cents.

Eggs remained unchanged. Portland reported exchange prices from 14c to 14c higher. Butter is reported as stronger in Portland but local quotations are the same.
