

Eugene Leads Opponents in Batting and Scoring in League

FIRST ROUND ENDS WITH LOCALS WELL UP IN HITTING LIST

Eugene's Willamette league baseball team, at the end of the first round of play, has out-hit its opponents and outscored them, according to statistics compiled from the official score sheet.

Eugene's hitting in the ten games played in the first round averages .285, while the hitting of all opponents in the ten games averages .235. Eugene scored 71 runs to her opponents' 51.

The team will be in Bend this Sunday, for the first game of the second round of league play. The schedule for the second round calls for six games, two each with Bend, Albany and Salem.

When the first round was played, Cottage Grove and Wendling also were in the league.

Twelve Eugene players are hitting above the team average, and several others are close to the average. Curley Fuller, pitcher, and Billy Baker, pitcher, lead the batting list, with one blow apiece out of two times at bat. Of the regulars, Les Johnson, first baseman, is leading the list, with .325. Jack Elias, catcher, is close on his heels, with .300. Cotter Gould, outfielder, is batting at a .444 clip, with Fred Hurton, pitcher, Bill Baker, pitcher, Billy Reinhardt, third baseman; Mulligan, third baseman; Harry Ellinger, outfielder; all batting above .300.

Bishop, Mulligan, Ellinger, Sorby, Frank Reinhardt, Brauner and Emmerson will not be with the team for the remainder of the season.

Chuck Wirth, shortstop, leads the Eugeneans in scoring with 15 runs to his credit. Elias is second, with 9.

Donald Hunsand, first baseman, leads the sacrifice hit list with 8. Others who have sacrificed include Manserud 2, Graham 2, F. Reinhardt 2, Van Dune 2, B. Reinhardt 2, Elias 2, Mulligan, Sorby, Burton, Johnson, and Barnes.

Graham and Manserud have been hit by pitched balls twice each, while Wirth and Grayson were hit once each.

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When the American Olympic Team Was Chosen



NO one need worry about the strength of the American Olympic track and field squad. Sensational performances in all events of the Olympic program during the final trials for the team held at Boston recently furnished enough assurance that the outstanding favorites at Amsterdam this summer.

Here are the first photographs of the final trials at Boston.

Frank Wykoff, the sensational sprinter from Glendale, Cal., who ran four qualifying heats in the 110-

meter event in Olympic record time of 10 3-8 seconds, is shown winning the final of this event in the upper left photograph. The sprinter in the photograph, reading left to right, are Russell (who finished third), Bracey (who finished fourth), Wykoff, McAllister (who finished second), and Quinn.

A unique finish of the final of the 110-meter hurdles is shown below the sprint trial. Ross Nichols of Stanford, who failed to make the team even though he ran a qualifying

heat in world's record time, was leading up to the last jump, where he tripped. He is shown here as he pitched to the ground. Anderson of

Washington won this event. The outstanding performance of the final trials was the leap of Ed Hamm of Georgia Tech, in the broad jump. He set a new world's record. His distance was 25 feet 11 1-8 inches. Hamm is shown in the center, up in the air, every muscle strained as he made his record-breaking jump. Lloyd Hahn, the Nebraska flyer, also established a new world's record

in the 590-meter event. Hahn ran this distance in 1:52 2-5. He is shown at the top right at the finish of his run.

Below Hahn is the finish of the 1500-meter race with Ray Conger, the Iowa, leading the field.

At the extreme right, Sabina Carr, scoring over the top to qualify as one of the American pole vaulters to go to Amsterdam, is shown.
