The accident happened near Grant's Pass, and the claim is set up that the hunter went to that place on official business and that the hunting was incidental, therefore that the widow should receive compensation from the state.

State Highway is Asked by Yamhill

SALEM, Ore., Dec. 21.—(AP)—Governor Patterson was asked yesterday by a delegation of Yamhill county citizens to use his influence towards having the River Road from Salem to Dayton designated as a state highway.

The road would connect with the West Side Pacific highway at Dayton, and the argument presented in its favor was that it would shorten the distance between Salem and Portland.

Stevens Extradition Request is Granted

SALEM, Ore., Dec. 21.—(AP)—Governor Patterson yesterday granted extradition on requisition from Idaho

for S. Stevens, who is wanted at Pocatello on two larceny charges. Stevens was in business here as a clairvoyant when arrested. A woman claiming to be his wife has instituted habeas corpus proceedings in his behalf, and a condition of the extradition is that Stevens shall not be taken from the state until the habeas corpus case is disposed of.

A telegraphic warrant received here also charges Stevens with swindling a Wisconsin woman out of \$13,000.
