RASPBERRIES MAY ADVANCE SOON

FIRST APPLES IN AT PUBLIC MART

The first green apples, Bermuda dry onions, and green peppers were in at the "Producers' Public Market" Saturday. The green apples, Gravenstein, were selling at 8c a pound, stall 6 have a display of them. The Bermuda dry onions were selling at 8c a pound at stall 4. Green peppers, retailing at 20c a pound, were on display at stall 3.

Retail prices on the whole remained about the same as for Thursday. Some of the new potatoes were quoted at 3c a pound, nine pounds for 25c although the most general price seemed still at 4c a pound, seven pounds for 25c.

Wax and green beans continued at 10c a pound.

Cucumbers were more in evidence, selling some at two for 5c, others at 5c each.

Eggs continued to retail at 34c a dozen.

Blackberries and loganberries were very plentiful, although red raspberries were not so numerous as they were Thursday. All prices continued the same. Raspberries and black caps at \$1.90 and \$2, the logans at \$1.25.

The quality of eggs has been all shot to pieces the past week or so due to the hot weather, report some of the local dealers.

Local producers are urged to take especially good care in keeping and handling eggs during the season. Eggs are subject to rapid deterioration during the hot weather unless good care is taken of them.

Unless the quality holds up or improves the price is due to drop, it was reported Saturday.

Producers should keep their eggs in cool place, such as the cellar, or a cool place built especially for eggs. Feeding of less green stuff is suggested during the hot weather.

When convenient producers should sell or deliver their eggs as quickly as possible during the hot months, as the dealers have equipment to keep the eggs at even and cooler temperatures.
