

## MANY EVENTS TO FEATURE CLOSING OF QUEEN CONTEST

A half-week of intensive activity is on the program for the closing days of the queen contest.

Besides the service clubs and Southern Pacific picnics Sunday, a big baseball game between the A. Guthrie Company and the American Legion is scheduled at the fairgrounds, starting at 2:30 o'clock. Each team is betting 25,000 votes on the outcome, and the winner also gets the entire gate receipts to be used to obtain votes.

The Odd Fellows band concert will be a big feature of Monday night. The McMoran and Washburne stores is sponsoring the concert at the city park blocks, starting at 7:45 o'clock. Included in the program will be 12 old American pieces. The general public will have an opportunity to enter the contest. The names of the pieces and the names of the composers must be included and all answers must be at the McMoran and Washburne stores or at the Sunset Trail headquarters by 6 o'clock Tuesday night. Two prizes will be offered, one of 75,000 and one of 25,000. Prof. Andrew Landies will direct the 40-piece band. Radio station KORE will broadcast the entire program. Answers may be brought in or mailed.

The queen committee will sponsor the "Queen Election Ball," Wednesday night at the armory. Returns will be given half-hourly. James K. King, chairman of the queen committee, is in charge and is arranging the program for the final night.

The service clubs will hold their big "Queen Susanah II" midnight frolic at the McDonald theater, Wednesday night, starting at 11:15 o'clock. Vaudeville and a talkie movie will be the main features. Manager Brown of the McDonald has arranged a fine program of festivities.

Beginning Monday morning 100 boys will distribute tickets for the Wednesday midnight matinee, according to John Bryson, chairman of the ticket sales committee. Hutch's bike shop and Henderson's are giving prizes to the two boys selling the most tickets and the McDonald will give every boy selling 10 or more a free pass to the theater.
