DISPUTE OVER WHO WON BATTLE TO END

BOSTON, Aug. 8.—(AP)—Yankee division veterans moved today to end the controversy over whether to their men or those of the second (marine) division A. E. F. belonged the honor of having captured Belleau, France, in the Aisne-Marne offensive of July 1918.

The dispute was brought to light with publication of plans of the 26th division pilgrimage to France next September, to dedicate a chapel to the division's dead at Belleau.

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
