

THREAT OF CREDIT PINCH CAUSES BIG FLOOD OF SELLING

NEW YORK, Sept. 5.—(AP)—Stocks were dumped overboard in huge volume in the last hour of trading in today's markets, a wide assortment of stocks losing from 5 to 10 points. The reaction came after the bull party had momentarily regained control, and sent up a wide assortment of leading shares 3 to 14 points to new highs.

The flood of selling was ascribed to fears of another credit pinch, incident to the heavy income tax payments and treasury refinancing in the middle of the month. It was accelerated by publication of a prediction by a leading economist of a market crash that would rival the collapse of the Florida land boom.

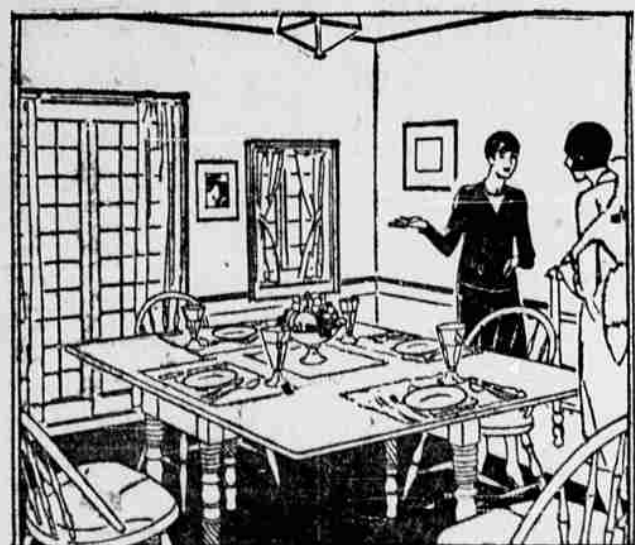

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SEARS ROEBUCK MAY TAKE EUGENE SITE

A new retail development is in prospect for Eugene with plans made for moving the house formerly occupied by Mrs. M. A. Mathews and at 141 West Broadway and the erection of a modern building on the site, it is announced by Carl G. Washburne of the West Broadway association.

The Sears, Roebuck Co. of Chicago which has been negotiating for some time for a retail store here is said to be considering the site. They recently opened a retail store in Portland.

The West Broadway association has arranged with Fred E. Chambers, owner of the property for the sale and immediate removal of the house, said Mr. Washburne. The ground will be cleared in readiness for the start of construction work as soon as the matter of a tenant is definitely settled, the building to be erected to suit the tenant.

The retail business which will be located in the proposed building will be in keeping with the development of the West Broadway district, the association, Mr. Washburne declared Friday.

The house, one of the fine old homes of Eugene, was vacated by Mrs. Mathews on Wednesday. The lot, 160 by 60 feet, is opposite the new public market.

DRIVER UNHURT IN UPSET, TRUCK FIRE

Lester Peterson of Eugene, operator of a large truck for the Pacific Fruit and Produce company, sustained minor injuries when the lights of his truck went out on a turn near Roseburg Tuesday evening, and the truck went over an embankment. Mr. Peterson was knocked unconscious, and came to himself to find the truck on fire. He was able to extricate himself without serious injury, but was unable to save the truck, which was completely destroyed by the flames.

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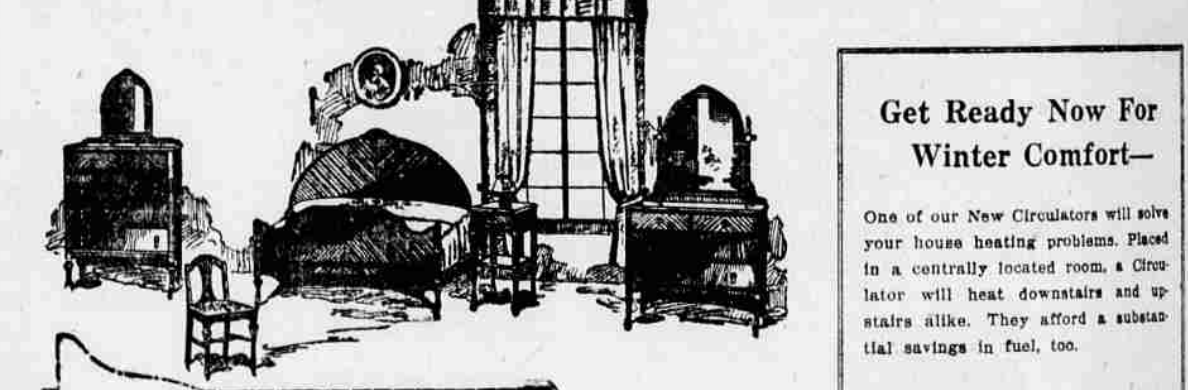
