Emergency Fruit Rates Extended

MEDFORD, Ore., Sept. 13.—(AP)—The emergency fruit rate of \$1.80 per hundred has been extended to June 1, 1935, by the transcontinental freight bureau upon application of the Southern Pacific.

The rate was to have expired Jan. 31, next. The extension permits cheaper shipment of winter variety of pears, held in storage, for late delivery in eastern markets. These shipments are expected to amount to 1500 cars.
