

POLK COUNTY STANDS TO LOSE OUT ROAD PROJECT

COMMISSION TO QUIT THERE IF MONEY NOT ADVANCED

Reimbursement Not Forthcoming \$500,000 Set Aside May Be Spent on Albany-Corvallis Route

PORTLAND, Ore., June 6 (Special to the Register).—Eugene Polk county commission is to reimburse the state for the cost of grading the west side Pacific highway, and money advanced for bridges, the highway commission will abandon further road work in that county. There is about \$500,000 set aside for hard-surfacing the west side highway in Polk county and the commission unanimously agreed at a special meeting today that this pavement money would be diverted to other places.

If Polk county fails to make the reimbursement there is a good prospect of the paving money being spent by the highway commission on the road between Albany and Corvallis. The main reason why the commission has been placed on the state map is because the commission saw no money in site for paving it. The half million dollars which is being held for hard-surfacing in Polk county would be gladly accepted on a co-operative basis by Benton county. There are several counties willing to go 50-50 with the highway commission on any state money the commission has available, so the money intended for Polk county will not go begging.

Old Disagreement Exists
For several years there has been a disagreement between Polk county and the highway commission centering largely on the location of the west side highway south of Monmouth. People of Independence wanted the road to go south from that town instead of from Monmouth and the matter has been fought in and out of the courts for several years. The commission at a roadside meeting held with officials and citizens, agreed, in exchange for locating the highway south from Monmouth rather than from Independence, to pave a road from Dallas to Salem. When this Dallas-Salem road was under way and partly hard-surfaced the Independence people undertook to upset the agreement and went to court. The courts have decided that the highway commission had the authority to make the location from Monmouth to south, and this, which was the main controversy, and which delayed road work, has been disposed of. The commission now wants a reimbursement for money expended for the grade and bridges.

Polk Holds Up Development
But for the attitude of the Polk county court the west side highway would have been paved completely through Polk county last year and the highway open the full distance from Portland. As a result of the situation in Polk county, through traffic now uses the Pacific highway on the east side to Albany, then crosses on a county road to Corvallis, where it again picks up the pavement and continues south. The county road between Albany and Corvallis has to carry practically all of the through travel now and Benton county is anxious to have it made a state road and paved. Judging from the attitude of the highway commission at the special meeting today Benton county is likely to have its wish.

STIRRING EVENTS IMPEND ALONG FERMANAGH FRONT

OCCUPATION OF CASTLE BY BRITISH IS LOOKED FOR

Arthur Griffith Leaves to Resume Peace Discussions With British Government

DUBLIN, June 6.—The Fermanagh front is quiet tonight, but stirring events are expected. Enniskillen reports that seven lorries loaded with republican forces from Sligo passed along the seashore route toward republican headquarters. The occupation of Magheramara Castle by the British is looked for.

DUBLIN, June 6.—Arthur Griffith, president of the Irish Free state, left Dublin for London tonight to resume discussions with the British government at a conference to be held in Downing street at 11:30 tomorrow morning.

It is understood that the London conference will center on the draft of the constitution, the Collins-De Valera pact being considered a subsidiary issue. It is not known whether the constitution has been altered materially since Mr. Griffith returned to Dublin, but it is certain that the draft is being taken to London to be submitted again to the British ministers.

WASHINGTON, June 6.—The national headquarters of the American Association for Recognition of the Irish Republic today issued a call for a special convention to be held here June 24 "to take action on the present crisis in Ireland."

Thomas J. Lyons, national secretary of the association, said the convention would launch a campaign to make Ireland's case an issue in the impending fall elections.

SWISS BUTLER IS DEPORTED

AUGUST PROBT NOTED FOR HIS AFFAIRS OF HEART

NEW YORK, June 6.—August Probt, young Swiss butler, whose heart affairs with Pittsburg society girls at the exclusive Rolling Rock club, were alleged by his friends to have moved others to railroad him out of the country, was deported today on the Mauretania.

The government engaged an attendant to accompany Probt, who attempted suicide by slashing his wrist at Ellis Island. The attendant is to report on the butler's physical condition and bring back a receipt from his parents, showing that the prodigal was returned to his home in Switzerland.

It was charged that Probt came to America without a passport.

CUTTING GRASS AND WEEDS
Section 1 of Ordinance No. 211 of Eugene, Oregon, provides that the owner, agent or occupants of any property within the corporate limits of Eugene shall cut and remove the grass, weeds, thistles and bushes growing in, along the streets and adjacent to their premises between the 15th day of June and the 25th day of June of each year.

Section 2 of said ordinance provides that if, not less than five dollars for neglecting or refusing to comply with said requirements. All owners, agents or occupants of property within Eugene, Oregon, are hereby notified to cut and remove the grass, weeds, thistles and bushes as by ordinance provided.
