### MATHEWS TO MAKE GREAT DEVELOPMENTS IN PLANT

Railroad and Steam Shovel Will Be Installed

EXTENSIVE BAR IS TAPPED

More Gravel to Be Obtained for Eighth Avenue Crusher to Fill His Large Orders

Extensive developments in his sand and gravel industry in this city involving the expenditure thousands of dollars were announced yesterday by A. C. Mathews, who operates a large gravel crushing machine and office on the bank of the Willamette river at the foot of Eighth avenue east.

Mr. Mathews has received from the factory in Indiana during the past few days a large Bucyrus steam shovel which he will operate in connection with his gravel plant and he will build a railway line from his crusher 1000 feet up the bank of the river on the Eugene side over which to transport gravel from the extensive bar that has been formed there during the past few years, to the crusher. The big steam shovel will scoop the gravel from the bar to tram cars to be hauled on the railroad by a "dinky" locomotive which Mr. Mathews says he has ordered. Orders have also been placed for the tram rails.

Shovel Brought Down Town  
The steam shovel, which is of the caterpillar tractor type, was brought down town from the gravel plant yesterday to be used in excavating for the new Crites block on Oak street, between Ninth and Tenth avenues. It was placed in position at the site of the new structure and will begin operations some time today. Mr. Mathews says he will use the big machine on other excavation contracts when it is not actively engaged in scooping up gravel.

Between 15 and 20 years ago, the Southern Pacific company built a trestle across the river where the Mathews gravel plant is now located and all summer long one year took gravel off the river, to be used in ballasting different sections of the main line. A railroad track a thousand feet long or longer was built and a steam shovel used to load the gravel into cars. The regular freight locomotives crossed this trestle and hauled long strings of gravel cars over the temporary track which was moved from time to time as necessity required.

To Work as S. P. D.M.  
Mr. Mathews will carry on similar operations except that he will get the gravel from the city side of the river and will use a smaller engine and smaller cars.

While there is still a considerable quantity of gravel to be had by the present method of dredging out the bottom of the river, Mr. Mathews said that he is unable to obtain enough in that manner to fill his extensive orders.

Mr. Mathews also announced a few days ago the purchase of a tract of land near the Coburg bridge where he will install a large crusher to crush basaltic rock to be dug from the side of the mountain.
