ALFRED VAUGHAN IS FATALLY WOUNDED BY MEXICAN

Father, A. L. Vaughan, of Waterville, Receives Telegram Telling of Tragedy

Alfred Vaughan, a native of Lane county, son of A. L. Vaughan, of Waterville, was fatally shot in the head by a Mexican laborer yesterday, according to a telegram received by his father from the Tampico Oil company, at Tampico, Mexico.

Vaughan was superintendent of operations for the oil company and the man who shot him had recently been discharged, said the telegram. It is presumed that the laborer attacked Vaughan in revenge.

Vaughan was aged about 40 years and was single. He had been working in the oil fields in Mexico for a good many years and had amassed a small fortune, his father says. He had written that he intended to leave Mexico in August of this year.

Besides his father he leaves quite a number of other near relatives in this county.

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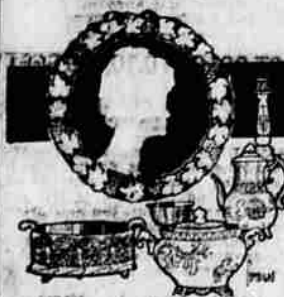
