

'DOMBEY AND SON' TONIGHTUNIVERSITY DRAMATIC SEASON
COMES TO CLOSEPlay at Eugene Theatre Tonight Last
of Season: Is Adaptation of
Dickens' Famous Novel

With a star cast of Guild hall players, the University of Oregon dramatic season will come to a close tonight with the presentation of "Dombey and Son" at the Eugene theatre. The play is a dramatization of the famous novel by Charles Dickens. Tonight will be the only opportunity which the public has of viewing the production, due to the fact that the presentation of it on June 17 will be a strictly invitational affair and will be largely attended by the graduates of the university and their relatives.

The part of Captain Dombey, an old seafaring man, will be taken by Mr. Reddie. Margaret Nelson will play

the part of Mrs. Pipchin, the austere caretaker of the younger Dombey. (Hildegard Rindge, an actress, will play a part different from any in which she has appeared this year.) The rest of the cast will be taken from the best dramatic talent on the campus.

The play, which is a dramatization of the story of Charles Dickens, was produced on the campus in 1918 and has been chosen again this year because it is a play with real dramatic power, and offers unusual work in character development.

The season which is closing has been the most successful dramatic season on the campus. This marks a steady growth in the work of the department and each year the work done is getting nearer to the work done by professionals. A great deal of the success of the department this year, according to Professor Reddie, head of the department, is due to the fact that the members of the companies have worked well and congenially together.

The department during this college year, with the production of "Dombey and Son," will have produced nine plays, which is an average of a play a month.

APPLE THINNING SHOWNDEMONSTRATIONS WILL BE
HELD NEXT WEEK

Meetings Planned at Santa Clara, Wilkesboro District and Creswell Thursday and Friday

A series of apple and pear thinning demonstrations is announced by Ira P. Whitney, county agent, for next week. On Thursday, June 15, the horticulturists will gather at the Santa Clara hall at 9 a. m. for a short meeting and will then go to nearby orchards to witness the thinning demonstrations. At 2 p. m. the demonstration will be held at M. H. Harlow and son's orchard in the Wilkesboro district and on Friday, June 16, at 3 p. m. one will be held near Creswell, the place to be designated later.

Figures compiled by Mr. Whitney show the benefits of thinning. In a commercial orchard where there was no thinning the owner received \$295.50 an acre off of his apples. Where the fruit was thinned from three to four inches apart he received \$585 per acre and where they were thinned six to seven inches apart, which is considered the proper distance, the amount received was \$812.50 per acre.

While the apple and pear crops will not be heavy this year and in many orchards no thinning will be necessary, there are some orchards where the fruit can be thinned to good advantage said Mr. Whitney.

BODIES OF SLAIN MEN FOUNDOFFICERS BLANCO MARTINEZ
AND GARCIA SHOT BY GUARDS

LAREDO, Texas, June 9.—The bodies of General Lucio Blanco, Colonel Martinez and Major Garcia killed by Mexican customs guards and soldiers Wednesday night as they headed an alleged invading party into Mexico were recovered from the Rio Grande today.

The bodies of Martinez and Blanco, handcuffed together were discovered by boys fishing on the American side near the Holding Institute and the railroad bridge here.

The body of Garcia was removed from the river a mile below this point.

Blanco, once prominent in Mexican military circles, but recently a refugee in the United States, had been shot through the heart. Martinez was shot through the head, while Garcia's body showed a wound in the neck.

One report has it that Garcia was not a member of the invading party, but was a federal officer and that he was shot accidentally by his own men during the confusion incident to the capture of Blanco.
