INSURANCE CAMPAIGN ON AIM FOR REINSTATEMENT OF \$5,000,000

The campaign for the reinstatement of war risk insurance is on in Eugene with the backing of the local legion post and Red Cross chapter. The government expects to induce the ex-service men throughout the country to reinstate insurance to the total of \$5,000,000.

Six insurance plans are open to the veteran who desires the reinstatement of his policy. The ordinary life, twenty-payment life, thirty-payment life, twenty-year endowment, thirty-year endowment and endowment maturing at age 62.

During the campaign ex-service men may avail themselves of free medical examination by Dr. R. H. Fields, who has been appointed to take charge of such work for the veterans bureau. The local office of the American Red Cross state that they will be glad to explain the insurance plan to any one desiring reinstating their policies.

MORE PAVEMENT PLANNED PETITION IN TO EXTEND FIFTH AVENUE SURFACING

Project Would Extend from Blair Boulevard to Polk Street, Distance of Three Blocks

Still more street paving is in prospect for Eugene. A petition has been presented to the city council, and it was to have come up for consideration last night, but was postponed on account of the city council meeting on Wednesday night. The petition is for extending the pavement from Blair boulevard to Polk street, a distance of nearly three blocks.

The petition bears the names of a majority of property owners along that section of the street. The petitioners say the cost will not be very heavy because of the fact that the Oregon Electric track extends along the middle of the street and the railway company will be compelled to bear a large portion of the expense.

APPOINTMENT IS APPROVED RED CROSS DIRECTORS PASS ON SECRETARY

The committee composed of Judge Skipworth, Earl Kilpatrick and Frank L. Armstrong, reported the confirmation of the appointment of Miss Grace Norton as secretary of the local Red Cross at a meeting of the board of directors held last night. Mrs. Robert Biddle, chairman of the production committee, reported that shipments of goods from Eugene to the federal hospitals at Portland had been completed, but that several shipments would yet be made to the hospital at Tacoma. These shipments consist largely of sweaters, convalescent suits and socks.

The board voted to co-operate with the American Legion in the campaign being carried on by the bureau of war risk insurance for the reinstatement of government insurance by ex-service men who have let their policies drop. Policies may be taken up through the Red Cross office and any information which the ex-service men desire in regard to their insurance can be obtained at the office of the Red Cross.
