LANE COUNTY DEMOCRACY MAKES POLITICAL PLANS

Party Leaders Are Confident of Victory

PLATFORM IS OUTLINED

Much Enthusiasm Marks Meeting of Executive Committee and Candidates Here Yesterday

Lane county democracy is in a jubilant mood and enthusiasm for the coming campaign is well above par, according to the county executive committee and the party candidates who gathered yesterday to outline their battle plans, construct a platform, and arrange for the financial support of war that are a necessary part of the political program of the organization. The meeting of the executive committee and the party candidates was held at the county courthouse yesterday afternoon and was marked by more hopeful conversation than has been heard at a Lane county session of Democrats for several years.

Candidates Attend Conference.—The executive committee headed by Harry Stewart, county chairman, and composed of J. R. Medley, J. E. Holden, Lark Hiley, R. E. Morgan and J. E. Noland conferred with the five county candidates for office on the party ticket and made tentative plans for the drive against the Republican opposition next November. The candidates present were L. L. Ray and Fred Pink, aspirants for places in the upper house of the legislature and George O. Knowles, Edward P. Bailey and Cal Young, candidates for state representative, and E. W. Zandwiler, candidate for county commissioner.

A vigorous campaign is to be launched by the party according to the committee members and candidates who are confident that this is a winning year for their cause and that all political signs are pointing to a Democratic victory. The platform adopted contains clauses providing for the primary law, strict economy, lower taxes, good roads, and opposition to the ownership of land by corporations. The present administration is charged with gross extravagance and with the creation of unnecessary offices and commissions.

Platform Is Presented.—The following is the party platform: Be it resolved, by the county central committee of the Democratic party of Lane county, state of Oregon, as follows:

We believe that those elected to office in this county and state should adhere to and advocate a policy of strict economy and reformation in the administration of public affairs and a reduction of the onerous tax burdens and the elimination of the extravagant methods employed by public servants in this county and state, to the end that the people may be relieved from the excessive tax burdens under which they now labor, and to this end we are in favor of and pledge ourselves and our nominees for office, to advocate, work for and enact, if possible, certain reforms tending to reduce and equalize the burdens and expenses of administering the affairs of the county and state governments.

We believe that the tax burdens now resting upon the people should be reduced in the aggregate amount of taxes levied for all purposes and should be adjusted in such manner as to create a fair and equitable distribution of the burdens of taxation upon all the property of the state, and, to that end, that a fair, reasonable income tax law be enacted, with proper safeguards and exceptions, so that the intangible property of the state may pay its just proportion of the administration of public affairs, with a provision that the aggregate amount of taxes to be levied on the tangible property shall not be increased thereby, that tangible property and particularly farm lands, shall be relieved of some of its present excessive burdens.

We are opposed to voting any further state or county bonds for any purposes, in addition to those already voted until such time, at least, as financial and economic conditions change in such manner as to warrant the voting thereof.

We believe in good roads and that those already constructed, under construction or provided for, should be completed and maintained economically, and without waste or extravagance. We believe that the market road law should be maintained and that the funds derived under its provisions should be expended upon market roads and that the county courts or the state highway commission should not be permitted to juggle the funds for road market road money upon state highways but that the same should be used, as intended, to improve the roads used by the farmers and others in reaching the markets and markets of the state.

We believe that the future of this county depends vitally upon the farmer and farming communities, and that, unless the farmer prospers, the whole state will suffer, and that the farmer is bearing an undue proportion of the burdens and expenses of the state government, and that he should be relieved of the excess burden by the elimination of some of the tax upon farm lands and tangible farm property, which should be placed upon those much better able to pay, thus equalizing the burden and affording the farmer some relief, that he may, at least, be permitted to exist and not be forced into bankruptcy.

We believe in supporting our institutions of learning and higher education to the end that they may be supported by a repeal of the so-called millage bill, and placing the matter of raising revenue for the support of these institutions back in the quagmire of politics.

We view with real alarm the tendency and threat of certain politicians of the county and state to repeal, overthrow and destroy and destroy the direct primary law, and to substitute therefor, the old rotten convention system, which, prior to the enactment of the direct primary law, had become a disgrace to the state and a stench in the nostrils of the public, and to be again relegated to the old convention system would be scandalous and a step backward, and a stepping stone to the repeal of all of the direct legislation upon the statute books of the state of Oregon, thus depriving the people of the state of the right of asserting their prerogatives at the polls upon any question of legislation however important it might be, and we hereby declare our unalterable opposition to the repeal of the direct primary law or any of our laws providing for direct legislation by the people, and we declare that if any of these laws are defective, that they should be made efficient by amendment and reform, rather than to be destroyed.

We proclaim ourselves in favor of a law prohibiting original ownership or leasing of lands and real property in this state or in the United States. We charge those in public places and who are conducting the affairs of

the public, in this state, with gross extravagance in the administration of public affairs, and with the creation of unnecessary and useless offices and commissions and with the employment of an army of useless employees and officials, and we advocate and demand that all useless boards and commissions be abolished, and that those that may be necessary be required to conduct their affairs with economy and to eliminate all waste and extravagance, without destruction of their efficiency, and thereby create a great saving to the people of the state.

Babcock, of the Menefee concern, H. Shannon, of the Shannon Lumber company, John Hills, of Hills brothers, Dexter, and Ernest Hyland, of the Hyland brothers' plant.
