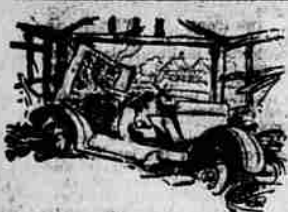

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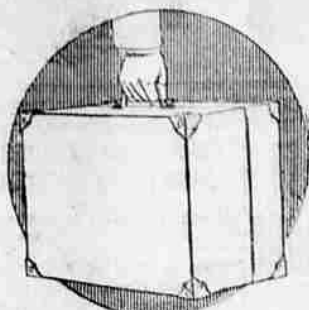

NO SOLUTION TO DOUBLE MURDER AT SANGER, CAL.

PAULINE GRASS, 16, AND ALEX WINTER ARE VICTIMS

All of Known Male Friends of Dead Girl Have Been Questioned Without Result

FRESNO, Cal., July 11.—Solution of the double murder at Sanger, 18 miles from here, Sunday night, in which Pauline Grass, 16-year-old Sanger school girl, and Alex Winter, her 21-year-old companion, are believed to have been slain by some rejected admirer of the slain girl, remained unsolved up to a late hour today.

County and local authorities have joined in a sweeping investigation for some tangible clue that will lead to the disclosure of the alleged murderer. Practically all of the known male friends of the dead girl have been questioned by the police without results, and the case stands today as one of the most baffling mysteries brought to light in this county.

The bodies of the youthful sweethearts were found Monday morning by a delivery boy. The girl was found lying face downward in a vineyard about 40 feet from where stood the automobile belonging to Winter. Winter's body was found huddled in the rear seat of the machine.

The first assumption that Winter had murdered his sweetheart and then turned the gun on himself during a lovers' quarrel was swept aside when autopsy surgeons found two bullets in the dead youth's brain.
