TWO DIVORCES GRANTED

COURT STRAIGHTENS OUT DOMESTIC TANGLES

Applications for Three Separations Filed Yesterday by People in Marital Difficulties

Granting of two decrees of divorce and the filing of applications for three others and the ordering of an increased amount for the support of the minor children of another divorced couple was the embellished activity of the circuit court yesterday for the straightening out of domestic entanglements.

Ruth Green Baldwin was awarded a decree of divorce from Ralph J. Baldwin on a charge of non-support, which was further aggravated, the plaintiff alleges, by the penchant of her husband for gambling. They were married in June 25, 1921. The plaintiff is allowed to resume her maiden name of Ruth Green.

Grace Stone of Cottage Grove was also granted a decree from U. S. Stone. Cruel and inhuman treatment was the charge of the plaintiff. The court ordered Stone to pay \$25 a month for the support of the minor child who will be in the custody of the mother.

The cases filed were Rena C. Laxton against James Laxton. The plaintiff alleges that her husband was intimate with other women and also charges him with insufficient support. They were married September 7, 1911. Isaac Goff of Cottage Grove filed a complaint against Salie E. Goff on grounds of desertion. They were married August 9, 1917, and have seven children, five of whom have reached a majority. Custody of the two minor daughters, age 14 and 16, is asked by the plaintiff.

Alma M. Worthington filed a complaint against P. W. Worthington on a charge of non-support and neglect. They were married at Dallas, Oregon, January 2, 1919 and have two minor children. A court order was also issued ordering Napoleon Hale to pay a further amount of \$75 for the support of his three minor children in custody of the mother, Bertha Virginia Hale. Other circuit cases yesterday were the filing of a suit by R. M. Davis to collect from C. N. and Mattie Loeby on a promissory note for \$669.87 alleged to have been signed at Harrisburg January 2, 1920. The bank of Shedd and S. S. Myers filed suit against Julia A. Brown to collect on promissory notes for \$1200 and \$750. The defendant is guardian for Rex, James, Charles and Cora Brown.

May Sanders was awarded a judgment by default against Charles Selwell for \$212.14 and attorneys fees.

FIRES ARE UNDER CONTROL

BUT FEW IN SHELLOW, STATES SUPERVISOR

Shelley Returns from Inspection Trip and Reports Progress on Road Work in Timber

With the exception of several small blazes, the Siuslaw national forest district is at present in no danger of a large conflagration, according to R. S. Shelley, supervisor of the forest, who returned to his local headquarters yesterday after a ten day inspection through the territory. Although the fire menace is well under control the official states that the present season has held more potential possibilities for a big blaze than any other period in the history of the reserve.

While in the coast district Mr. Shelley inspected the new road construction work that is now in progress in the national forest. A new stretch of road a mile and one-half in length running from the government light-house property at Hecla Head to the northern boundary of Lane county was looked over. New improvement and repair work is also in progress on about five miles of the forest roads and trails in the Siuslaw district, states the supervisor.

The camp fire permit plan which is now in effect is an excellent plan for the prevention of carelessness in regard to forest fires, according to Mr. Shelley, although the Siuslaw district has but few campers, he adds, as this majority of those who visit the western part of the county are on private land. No permits have yet been issued for campers in the Siuslaw district, according to the report of the office.

ROAD CONTRACTS AWARDED

JOBS FOR TWO COUNTY PROJECTS ARE LIST

Johnson-McCormick Concern Will Build Cushman Route and Goldard-Myers to Have Canby Work

Contracts for two Lane county projects were awarded yesterday by the county court. The contract for the Cushman-North Fork road, which amounts to 2000 feet of grading, was awarded to the Johnson-McCormick concern on a bid of \$5810. The Canby road grading project of 3000 feet was awarded to the Goldard-Myers company on their bid of \$3025. Work on these projects will start immediately, according to the announcement of county road officials.

Bids will soon be advertised also for the proposed road stretch of 4000 feet of road near the Cushman station. This project is being financed through the cooperation of the Southern Pacific rail lines and Lane county. As soon as the grading is completed on these three road projects the graveling will start at once under the direction of the forestry department, according to the report of the road officials.

Several contractors submitted bids on the road work yesterday. The Goldard-Myers concern bid \$5961 on the Cushman work and the Lyons firm \$7015. An incomplete bid of \$5795 was received from George Landy. The work on the contracts is to be pushed rapidly as all the equipment is available for immediate action.
