HARRISBURG NEWS NOTES

HARRISBURG, Ore., Feb. 6.—(Special to the Register)—Almost to the hour, the fire siren sounded forth here again Thursday afternoon about three o'clock the same as it had done the previous Thursday. This time an oil stove in one of the closets at the local hotel used for thawing out frozen water pipes suddenly exploded with the result that flames soon began to eat out the interior of the small room and the alarm was given. The flames were quickly extinguished by a hastily formed bucket brigade. The company's equipment did not have to be used. Sam Wamboldt, who had been the city's night watchman for nearly a year, did not patrol the streets of the city in the dead of night Thursday. His services were ended the night before and Douglas Love, who was recently elected city marshal is the night watchman. Mr. Wamboldt has had an enviable record as a night watchman, having faithfully served in this capacity for many concerns and with great dependability. The name, Lelsy's pharmacy, is no more, as far as Harrisburg is concerned. With the removal of this firm into its commodious new quarters last Tuesday in the store room next to the Harrisburg National bank, it also underwent a change in name. The new store certainly presents a nifty appearance. Sidney W. Claypool, the manager, will continue to run the business. The announcement comes that the Southern Pacific company is about to have the passenger siding of its railroad in the local yards lengthened 1000 feet at the north switch, and the rumor is also current that the siding will be extended to connect with the siding at the oil station which would, altogether, lengthen the passenger track about 3000 feet and thus make a much needed improvement as time and again the present siding facilities have proved inadequate to handle meeting trains with readiness. Another ferry accident occurred here last Saturday when the rear wheels of a car driven by Lloyd Simon of Halsey dropped into the Willamette as he was driving into the ferry from the landing on the west side. No damage resulted and the only inconvenience was the blocking of traffic for about half hour while the car was being gotten back onto the boat. The Mountain States Power company is offering a reward for the apprehension of any person guilty of breaking insulators on any of its lines between Springfield and Albany. Recent investigation of lines shows that some one is purposely breaking the insulators, and especially is this the case from Harrisburg south. Company officials are quite well convinced of this.
