Sunday morning's papers contained the news that a serum produced by the Mayo foundation at Rochester, Minnesota, as a possible cure for "sleeping sickness" has been successfully used in three cases at El Paso, Texas.

Encephalitis lethargica, or "sleeping sickness," is due to a filterable virus found in the central nervous system and in the secretions from the nasopharynx.
