DAILY MARKET REPORT

OREGON JOURNAL MARKET SERVICE
PORTLAND, Ore., April 12—Market for eggs is somewhat firmer in character locally. Bids of 1/2 to 1/4 advance are shown in some instances at country points for Portland delivery. Current receipt purchases are at 23¢/1/2 for a dozen with henneries at 23¢/2/4 although few are offering the extreme.

With demand for eggs from practically all sections, both for fresh use and for storage, the current supply now coming forward is just about adequate to fill requirements. Competition for supplies unusually active and bids are being a very good situation for sellers. Buyers are working on a closer margin than usual.

BUTTER SITUATION IS MIXED
Market for butter continues to reflect an undertone of weakness in spots, but some of the leading makers report a greater demand than at output with bids at 40¢ a pound. North is still being low.

SUGAR ADVANCE BROWN AGAIN
Further advance of 1/2¢ per hundred pounds will be quoted in the price of all grades of sugar in the Portland wholesale trade, effective at the Friday opening. California refiners quote the rise.

WHEAT MARKET IS BARELY HEAVY
With very liberal supply offering, the market for country wheat is weaker and generally lower with a further dip in values likely with increasing stocks available. General tone no higher than 15¢. Highs are steady at 12 to 13¢ for top, the latter being at extreme.

FERT GAIN CHILL SPINDS DUE
Temporary scarcity of spindles will be the feature of the season from the San Francisco section is due to arrive here in the near and will probably be offered on the Friday market at 15¢ per pound.

ASPARAGUS STOCKS ARE SCARCE
Temporary scarcity of asparagus was shown in the market Thursday but liberal stocks are due for Friday. California selling around 15¢ per pound generally with Oregon long green at 12 to 13¢ for down bunches.
