SPRINGFIELD, Ore., May 9.—One small girl, bare footed and dressed only in a blue frock, kept the whole town of Springfield at bay for a good part of the afternoon today. She perched on the drinking fountain in front of the bank on Fourth and Main streets, and by a skillful manipulation of the water faucet, held all who approached at a safe distance.

Her shots at first occasionally missed the intended victims and "backfired," thoroughly soaking her from head to foot and wetting down the sidewalk for several feet.

All efforts to induce her to surrender were futile, until she tired of the sport and left her "water-hold" of her own accord. She refused to give her name or to cite any cause for enmity against the residents of Springfield.
