B. club, held in the B'nai B'rith hall here. The rabbi also pointed out the part played by Jews, not only in winning the world war, but the Revolutionary war and others. "There was in the United States," Rabbi Kreuger said, "a greater percentage of Jews enlisted, in proportion, than any other denomination."
