Great Essayist of Lovable Personality, Says Speaker

ECCENTRIC AND VITAL

"Emerson is to be read as the scriptures are to be read—a sentence at a time. One arouses the soul, the other the mind. His literature abounds in challenges."

In discussing Emerson's essays, and the way in which he went about writing them, the speaker said that he had never ceased to marvel at the fact that a man who wrote on such abstract subjects as "Compensation," "Self-Reliance," "Love," "Friendship" and "Character," could still command such a large audience. 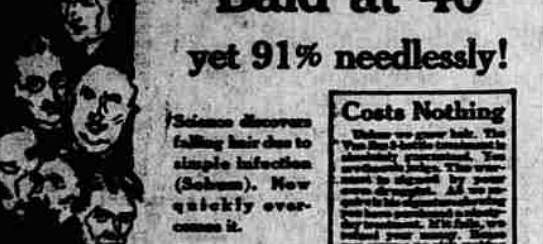

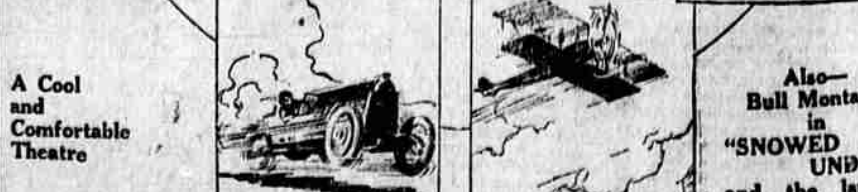
