## MONEY VOTED TO FIGHT EARWIG PEST IN EUGENE

### City Council Gives \$50 to Pay For Poison

### EARLY ACTION IS TAKEN

Bugs Found in Several City Blocks—County Court Asked to Co-operate

Earwigs have been found in different parts of Eugene in considerable numbers and the city council has taken prompt steps to eradicate the pest before any damage is done.

Following the announcement yesterday by C. E. Stewart, county fruit inspector, and George W. Taylor, assistant inspector, that the bugs that have bothered Seattle and Portland quite seriously during the past year or two have made their appearance in Eugene, Samuel W. Mosher, president of the city council, in the absence of Mayor E. B. Parks called a special meeting of the council last night to consider means to fight the pest. It was voted to appropriate \$50 to purchase a mixture which will be hauled to the different parts of the city where the bugs have been located and furnished the residents free if they will attend to the spreading of it.

The county court will be asked to appropriate a similar amount of money and Judge Barnard, who was present at the meeting, said he thought that there would be no trouble in obtaining it.

Inspector Stewart said last night that they found eight city blocks infested and it is quite probable that the bugs may be found elsewhere as they have not had time to go all over the city. The pest appeared the worst in the block in which the Methodist and Christian churches are located and in the block south of the city hall than anywhere else. The other infested districts are in the northwestern part of the city. The earwig is described as being brown in color, with a long slim body with pincers on both ends. It is usually about half an inch long and sometimes longer. It travels with a quick motion.

Portland Acted Late  
Mr. Stewart said that earwigs have existed in some of the cities of the Northwest for a long time and until last year the people of Portland looked upon them as a joke but when the seriousness of the epidemic, as it may be called, was realized, they took prompt action. Eugene by taking action now will be more successful than Portland in its campaign for the reason that the bugs have not yet spread over a great deal of territory.

The city street department will furnish a truck and a number of men Saturday to distribute the poison and Fruit Inspector Stewart said that he will attend to the mixing.

It was stated at the meeting last night that city lots where there is rubbish and where sanitation is poor and fifth-abounds are the best breeding places for the bugs. The campaign now being waged by the city officials, the Federation of Women's Organizations and others to clean up the city will probably be continued with a great deal more vigor than ever, for it is known that the cleaner one's premises are the less apt he is to find earwigs.

B. B. Fulton, associate entomologist at the Oregon Agricultural college, gives some interesting information concerning the destruction of the pestiferous bug. Mr. Fulton in a recent bulletin says:

**Pest Eats Everything**  
"This serious pest devours the vegetables, fruits and flowers of the garden. It invades residences, and its presence in the house is offensive. Because of its filthy habits it is decidedly unsanitary. It is a potential menace to the great fruit industry of Oregon, wherever it has become abundant property values have depreciated."

"Earwigs can be controlled. At a cost of a few dollars and a little work during a few evenings of the year this pest can be so reduced in numbers that it is no longer a nuisance."

**Formula for poison bran:**  
Sodium fluoride.....12 ounces  
Molasses.....2 quarts  
Wheat bran.....12 pounds  
Water.....6 quarts

"Dissolve the sodium fluoride in the water, stir in the molasses, add this mixture to the bran and mix thoroughly. If this is not enough liquid to wet all the bran a little more water can be added, but do not have it wet enough to drip without being pressed."

"Directions for using poison bran: The poison bran should be scattered about the ground in the evening just before dusk. Scatter the bran thinly over all grass plots. By throwing with a wide swing of the arm it can be scattered more evenly and quickly than by simply dropping it from the fingers. More material should be applied around the walls of the house and other buildings, along the edge of walks, walls, fences and curbing and around trees, bushes and other objects which are apt to afford a hiding place for the earwigs."

"Do not sprinkle the lawn for two or three days after spreading the bran, for this washes out the poison. The amount of materials given in the formula is enough for an ordinary city lot, and one treatment properly applied should kill the majority of earwigs within a few days."

"It is well to follow up the general application of poison bran by the use of a spray of a mixture of poison bait applied to trees, walls and other objects several times during the summer, to catch the earwigs after they begin to climb at night."

**Use Mixture Desired**  
"For this purpose it is well to have a mixture which will not dry for several days. This may be accomplished by substituting glycerin for a third of the amount of liquid used. Out h'lls will make a mixture which will stick to objects better than wheat bran. The following mixture is suggested:  
Sodium fluoride.....1 ounce  
Molasses 5 ozs. (one-third pint)  
Glycerin.....5 ounces  
Water.....5 ounces  
Out h'lls.....About 1 pound

"Mix by dissolving sodium fluoride in the water first, add molasses and glycerin, and mix with enough out h'lls to make a wet mash. Smear pinches of this in the crevices of all trees; leave pellets of it at intervals of about six feet along all fences and walls and along the top of the house foundation, in cracks of barns and other buildings, or anywhere that the earwigs are seen crawling."

"Sodium fluoride is poisonous to human beings, but death from its use is rare. Wherever small children are present care should be used to prevent them from eating any of the poison bran. It should be scattered on the ground. Material applied to trees and other objects should be placed beyond the children's reach. The same precaution should be used in regard to poultry. A thorough sprinkling of the grounds with water after the bran has been on a couple of nights will wash out the poison."

"Clean up. The work of controlling the earwig can be aided very materially by doing away

### S. P. SURVEYORS AT WORK

CREW IS NOW LOCATED AT MULE PRAIRIE  
Headquarters are at McCredie Springs—12-Animal Pack Train Is Used

A crew of 25 or more engineers employed by the Southern Pacific company to make the resurvey of the Natron cutoff over the summit of the Cascades, is now encamped at Mule Prairie, near Salt creek falls, about 20 miles above Oakridge, and the headquarters are at McCredie Springs, according to Al Haynie, government packer, who is in the city. The party has 12 pack animals at work carrying supplies to the camp.

Mr. Haynie said that George H. Kelly is making good headway on the site of his new mill on the north fork below Oakridge. He has a big camp tent up and has erected several bunk tents. One crew is excavating for a railroad siding where the machinery and other materials for the big plant will be sidetracked. He said that a great many men are going to Oakridge now and it is expected that the little town will soon begin to grow fast.

### HIGHWAY WILL BE ROLLED

AGREEMENT REACHED IN HOLLAND HILL SECTION  
Contractors Will Lay Same Surface as Being Laid on Hadleyville Street

The Holland Hill section of the territorial road near Crow, which has just been graded, will have a rolled and water bound macadam surface, according to agreement signed yesterday by the members of the county court, and the Igo Construction company, which has the contract.

The surfacing will be the same as that which is being laid on the Hadleyville section of the highway, according to the agreement, the contractors to be paid at the rate of \$2.75 per yard for the rolling and watering.

The citizens of that locality had presented a petition signed by practically every property owner in the district asking that the highway be rolled. The original contract called for a surfacing of loose crushed rock, which, according to many road builders, makes an inferior surface.
