BIG COUGAR IS KILLED
ANIMAL BROUGHT DOWN ONLY 30 FEET FROM HUNTER

RAINBOW CAMP, Ore., Aug. 22.—Henry S. Westbrook, of Portland, was successful in bagging a large cougar last week. He came upon the animal in the East Fork canyon seven miles from here. It took four bullets to kill the beast, the shot which brought the cougar down being fired only 30 feet from the hunter.

The first shot which wounded the cougar badly was fired at a distance of 125 yards. After being wounded at that distance the animal charged Mr. Westbrook and was uncomfortably near when finally killed. The animal measured eight feet ten and one-half inches from tip to tip and was a beautiful specimen.

Deer are very plentiful in the Siskiyou and Coquille country, and are beginning to trail. Seven large bucks were seen by Mr. Westbrook at one time while on the cougar hunt.

Highway Opens in Creswell
