POTATO SITUATION VERY QUIET
Because of the loading up of the local market by Yakima, there is a very slow trading tone shown for local potatoes here. It costs approximately \$1.50 per cwt. to land Yakima stock here, which is even more than what home growers are asking. Sales to retailers at \$1.85 to \$2.00 for Yakimas. Locals at \$1.65 to \$1.75.
