PLANT IN OCTOBER

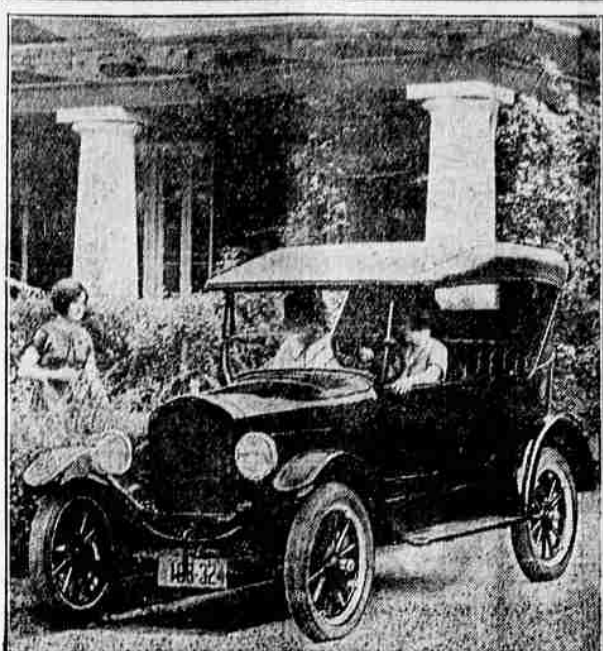
This Is Heralded As the Greatest

when approximately 23,000 cars
were shipped from the plant in
Flint, and over 21,000 delivered to
owners, the balance which were

dustry when it is remembered that
the record was made in a normally
slack season.

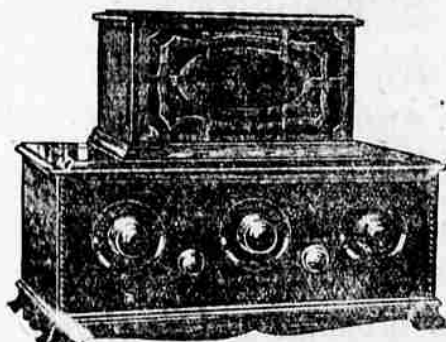
25,904 DRIVERS STOPPED

MANY INFRACTIONS OF LAW
IN CALIFORNIA

During the month of September,
25,904 motorists in California were
stopped for violation of the state
motor vehicle act. These were di-
vided as follows:
Speeding, 4,232; illegal lights,
14,759; violations of the rules of
the road, 3,045; miscellaneous, 3,
877.

Of this number 8,042 were cited
to appear. Illegal lights led with
4,532 arrests; speeding accounted
for 2,985; violations of the rules of
the road brought 672 into court
and 333 were cited for miscellane-
ous violations. Of the motorists
arrested in the month of Septem-
ber, 1187 were fined and 128 di-
mished. In this thirty day period
the state traffic officers covered a
total mileage of 271,033 miles in
patrolling their beats. Five thou-
sand one hundred eight dollars and
eight cents were collected in de-
linquent fees and fines totaling
\$33,736.50.

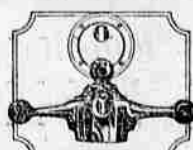

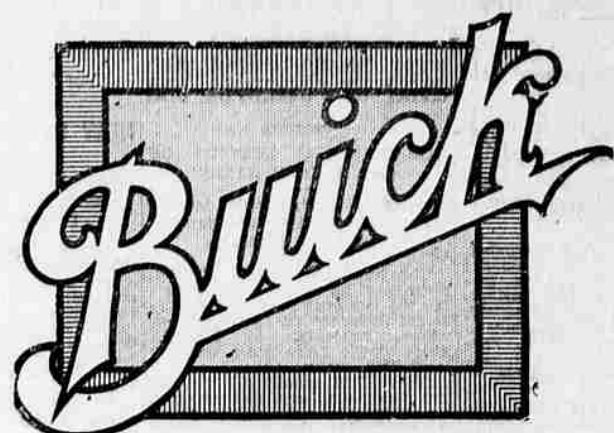

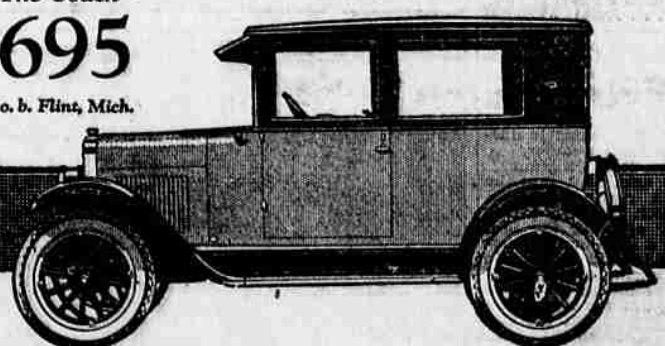
