PROPERTY DEALS MADE

LOTS AND HOUSE IN SPRINGFIELD CHANGE HANDS

New Owner to Build on E Street Site in Near Future; Gas Station to Rise

(Register Lane County Special) SPRINGFIELD, Ore., Dec. 5.—Two sales of property and one lease of a business site were reported here today. John Sankey bought lots 17 and 18 in block 89 on E street from A. P. McKinney of Eugene. The lots are not improved but Mr. Sankey intends to build on the site in the near future. The seven-room house and lot on K street near Tenth street was sold by W. T. Alvadore to C. M. Shidler. Both deals were made by the A. F. Flowers Realty company. A new gasoline service station will be erected on the northeast corner of Seventh and Main street by George Carson. It was announced. Ground was broken for the structure today and it is believed that the station will be ready for occupation by the first of the year. The site on which the building is to rise was leased by Mr. Carson from A. J. Perkins and W. W. Stevens, the owners. The lease covers a period of five years.
